

Parents are you Home "Bible" Schooling your Kids?

Due to the pandemic, most parents with school-age children have been introduced to the world of homeschooling, like it or not. Now even before the pandemic many Christian families have chosen to homeschool their children, and feel their children learn better in this type of environment. Regardless of how one chooses or is "compelled" to educate their child, I believe it is vital that all parents "home 'Bible' school" their children. Especially since the pandemic has interfered with our regular scheduled children's Bible classes.

The Bible teaches us that it is our job and responsibility as parents to train our children in the ways of the Lord.

Deut. 6:5-7, teaches us, "You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise."

Then in the New Testament, Eph 6:4, commands, "Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord."

Then we learn in 2 Tim. 1:5 and 2 Tim. 3:15 how Timothy was taught the scriptures from his youth by his mother and grandmother.

Josh Mcdowell, once wrote, "God emphasizes the importance of parents teaching the Bible to their children. The church and Christian school [Bible School as well] cannot be used to escape from this responsibility."

Please do not misunderstand, I am very happy that we have Bible classes for our children, and we have great Bible class teachers who do a wonderful job at teaching the Bible, but they cannot take a parents place in teaching the Bible and God's truths.

Children are watching and learning from us as parents every day. They know what we believe and how we live out the teachings of the Bible or not. They know if we lie or cheat, pray, or read our Bibles.

So, are we "home 'Bible' schooling" our children? Here are some suggestions on ways we can teach our children the Lord's Word at home:

- Have daily Bible devotionals, where Bible reading, teaching, and praying takes place.
- As you go through your day, and children have questions, try to always point them to the Bible. Have older children lookup the passages in their Bible to find answers to their questions.
- Work with your children to know where the books of the Bible are found, memorize the Old and New Testament books, give them memory verses and encourage them to read the Bible.
- Talk about your child's Bible class. Have them review the lesson and encourage them to do any homework the teachers assign, and if they need to return a homework paper then make sure your child follows through.
- Live the Bible in your everyday life, so your children know what it means to be a Christian, to be kind, loving, joyful, and deal with problems of life in a biblical way and not in a way the world would deal with them.

Parents, we cannot leave our child's Bible education to chance. Question: Are you home "Bible" schooling your kids?

God Sets the Terms of Our Surrender

Text: Luke 19:42

How much worse could General Grant's terms of surrender have been?
If Lee were not willing to accept them what was his other option?
What do you think of the terms of surrender Ben-Hadad delivered to Ahab (1 Kings 20:2-3)?
Why do you think Ahab initially accepted these terms?
When Pharaoh picked a fight with God how well did it go? How much better would life have been if he had accepted the terms of surrender?
When the prodigal son went to make peace with his dad how well did the son think it was going to go? Was the reality better or worse than his expectations?
What are God's terms of peace? (Romans 5:1)
If we don't like these terms are there any other? If we don't take them what are we deciding to do?

Doug's Discussion

God is Good and I Am Glad

Just imagine being born into a universe made by a god who isn't as kind and compassionate as our God. Instead of being loving and just this god resembles some of the gods of ancient mythology: impulsive and cruel. People struggle against his will (as people are known to do) but ultimately the devastating punishments are just too much to bear. With broken spirits the people of this unfortunate world collectively say: "we give up. What must we do to have peace?" Having all the power in the situation this god can set whatever terms he wants.

We should consider ourselves greatly fortunate that we do not live in such a place! I can only imagine what terrible conditions could be set forth by an omnipotent dictator. Perhaps the answer would be . . . "To have peace with me you must all: 1) Run full speed into a brick wall at least once a day. 2) Pointlessly burn every other paycheck and 3) You must kill your firstborn child so you are reminded I can kill you all anytime I want." Even in the real world some have thought that was the nature of God. Cultures throughout the Old Testament worshiped by mutilating themselves and sacrificing their children in the fire. I am mighty glad they were wrong.

"And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God" (Micah 6:8). The terms God gives us for peace with Him are SO much better than they could be. Instead of humiliating us God gives us commands that are for our good. Instead of paying us back double for our sins God sends His Son Jesus to pay the price for us. Do you know how grateful you should be? You have no control over who God is. But life is good – because God is good. Because God is good everything He wants from us will be the best thing for us. Because God is good let us all praise Him for being who He is and for not being all the terrible things some have imagined Him to be.

GOD IS GOOD

When I Pray I Can...

- Acknowledge that my help comes from above (Psalm 121:1-2).
- Acknowledge if God is for me, no one can be against me (Romans 8:31).
- See my unworthiness contrasted with the magnificence of God (Nehemiah 1:5-7).
- As a child, talk to my Father (Matthew 7:11).
- Pursue the will of God in my life (Matthew 26:39).
- Seek true wisdom (James 1:5).
- Seek the blessings of God on behalf of ones I love (John 17:19-21).
- Seek forgiveness even for my secret sins (Acts 8:22).
- Ask whatever I want, according to His will (1 John 5:14).
- Have confidence that my prayer will be heard (1 John 5:14-15).
- Thank God for all He has done/is doing on my behalf (Philippians 2:13, 4:6).
- Thank God for my brothers and sisters in Christ (Philippians 1:3).
- Draw close to God (James 4:8).
- Petition God on behalf of the sick (James 5:13, 16).
- Take advantage of the promises God has made (Hebrews 13:5).
- Tap into the vast resources of heaven (Ephesians 3:20).
- Request help in resistance of the devil (Ephesians 6:18).
- Win a battle against the devil (James 4:7).
- Separate myself from the world for a while (Matthew 6:6).
- Expect mercy and grace in time of trouble (Hebrews 4:16).
- Find peace (Philippians 4:7).
