Doug's Díscussíon

Do You Know When You Do Evil?

How often do you think an immoral person knows that their daily conduct is evil? I once had a tax advisor from a well-known company (which shall not be named) who told me I should lie on my taxes to save some money. She apparently was feeling guilty for being wrong about my refund amount and I guess was offering that as a consolation prize. Note: she wasn't my tax person the year after that. I wonder if she looked in her mirror that night and confronted her loose arrangement with the truth. I'm leaning toward probably not, unfortunately.

I believe people have a built-in sense of right and wrong. I also believe this sense can be suppressed. Romans 1:18 teaches that truth can be suppressed by wickedness. Make the wrong choice enough times and you may lose the knowledge that the choice is wrong. Wrong choices can become as automatic as driving home from work. And that's why it is so important to look into the mirror! Or as Hebrews puts it, "See to it, brothers and sisters, that none of you has a sinful, unbelieving heart that turns away from the living God" (Hebrews 3:12).

I think we're much better at identifying sinful conduct in other people than in ourselves. Maybe because we don't want to see it. But we need to! Open up your eyes and consider whether or not you're still on the right road. Judge yourself so that there is no need for judgment. Who knows if Hitler or Stalin thought to themselves "yeah, I'm totally evil?" They didn't get that way overnight. Perhaps their poor character began with justifying seemingly minor poor choices. Perhaps it was their habit to judge others but to never judge themselves.

See to it, brothers and sisters, that your heart is set on what is right. That your eyes look to Jesus. That you consider others as better than yourselves. That no idol has taken the place of God. See to it that you believe the Word of God over the ever-changing words of men. Confront yourself if you are failing in these ways. Whether you're guilty of mass murder or tax evasion the right move is to repent and turn back to the living God. I pray you will.

BIBLE CALL REPORT December 2020

Let us keep up the good work of calling and telling others about the Bible Call program. We had 212 CALLS in DECEMBER. This represents more than 21 hours of teaching the Bible via this means.

The high days were the 30th with 20 calls and the 19th with 10 calls.

The most requested calls were for 306 Repentance (10), 321 The Holy Spirit (9), 201 Why Does God Allow Trouble? (8),115 Overcoming Depression (7), 102 What is the church of Christ (6), 555 Should the Lord's Supper Be Observed Every Sunday? (6) Many calls were listened to more than once, 8 times people asked to hear a list of topics on the phone and 8 times people listened to the lesson again.

In these times that are so challenging we have an opportunity to reach into homes with the word. Other congregations are seeing this and starting mailing. Steelton in New Martinsville is mailing monthly. The Elders at McConnelsville, OH where Bro Tom Butterfield is preaching have set up a local number that feeds into the service here and they have done their first mailing. We have had calls from other congregations about how to get involved in this good work. Let us Call daily and get the word out to others personally and to sister congregations.

Let us continue to call daily, hand a leaflet to those you meet, and reach out to others personally and by mail. Pray God continues to bless this good work.
