Read it today!

At the beginning of every year, many people like to set goals and make New Year's resolutions. This year I have challenged the congregation to read "Through the Bible in 2021." So how are you doing in reading your Bible daily?

You may have done well in the beginning, but now it's February. Have you allowed the Bible to collect dust again?

Let me encourage you not to give up now or if you have not started reading your Bible can I encourage you to start today?

It is said that it takes 21 days to form a new habit, so if you began reading your Bible today and read it for the next 21 days you will be on your way to a new good habit.

With that said, I hope we can understand that Bible reading and study is more than just a good habit. Romans 10:17, tells us, "So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God." Bible study is what helps us to have faith and that which gives us faith can also help us grow in faith.

Notice this recent study on the value of daily Bible study by Lifeway (<u>https://</u> <u>lifewayresearch.com/2021/01/20/9-tangible-benefits-of-bible-reading-for-your-church/</u>). This research found that when a person reads the Bible for at least four days a week people:

- 1. Feeling lonely drops 30%
- 2. Anger issues drop 32%
- 3. Bitterness in relationships drops 40%
- 4. Alcoholism drops 57%
- 5. Sex outside of marriage drops 68%
- 6. Feeling spiritually stagnant drops 60%
- 7. Viewing pornography drops 61%
- 8. Sharing your faith jumps 200%
- 9. Discipling others jumps 230%



The Bible will help us to be a better Christian, Paul instructed Timothy in 2 Tim. 2:15, "Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly handling the word of truth." This begins with you and me reading God's Word, will you read it today?

Doug's Discussion

Change Can Be Good

I think that change is a funny word. You can get all kinds of interesting reactions from people by saying the word "change." I think it's better than "boo!" Try it sometime . . .walk up behind someone and say "I'd like to change . . ." and see what happens. As a general rule people hate change! We don't think we need it. And that's going to cause us problems with a God who wants to change a lot. Listen: "And we, who with unveiled faces all reflect the Lord's glory, <u>are being transformed into his likeness</u> with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit (2 Corinthians 3:18). The Bible says we are being transformed into the likeness of God. God is, little-by-little, changing us so that we look like His Son. Is something in your life not Christ-like? Then God wants you to change.

God wants to change the way we speak, our attitude toward sin, the way we dress, the things we do, the way we treat our spouse and our kids and our friends, our church attendance, and everything else. In fact, being a genuine Christian involves so much change that people might not recognize us anymore. There should be an obvious contrast between before Jesus and after Jesus. The Bible calls it an old life and a new life. "We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life" (Romans 6:4). A whole new life. The old life is dead and gone. THAT is what God is accomplishing in you through Christ.

So if your new life looks like your old life then maybe your new life isn't what God has in mind. Are you willing to change? I think that if we give our life up to God then God will do something wonderful. "For just as the Father raises the dead and gives them life, even so the Son gives life to whom he is pleased to give it" (John 5:21). You can have your life. OR you can give up your life and have the life God gives. Which do you think is better? I suggest letting God change whatever He wants.

You can read on every pack of cigarettes that they are bad for your health. So bad, in fact, that sometimes a doctor will give the patient a clear choice. Something like, if you don't stop smoking you'll be dead in a couple of years. Now let me tell you what I find shocking - statistically, in that scenario, the smoker would rather die. It's true - most won't quit, even when a deadly consequence is at the door.

Let's face it. We don't like to change. Choosing to live life differently takes a lot of work - so we would rather tell ourselves that everything is fine. We think: I can live the way I want and it will be all right. People have been doing that for a long time. Long ago God told the prophet Jeremiah: "They dress the wound of my people as though it were not serious. 'Peace, peace,' they say, when there is no peace." (Jeremiah 6:14)

If you're a Christian doing the will of God then it makes sense to say there's peace. But if you aren't you can say whatever you want - but it won't change that there's no peace apart from God.


