Baptism Revisited


Some things are non-negotiable. Some things are negotiable. Baptism is non-negotiable.

By faith, Jesus went to a grave. No grave - no resurrection - no faith. Faith that does not "Pass through" is not faith. Just as the "Father of the Faithful," Abraham trusted in the resurrecting power of the God of heaven by offering Isaac, so too, we trust the same resurrecting grace by offering our lives to God as we step into the template of Jesus' own death, burial, and resurrection - baptism. The early church believed that faith without baptism was not faith and that baptism without faith wasn't baptism. Let's list some things that the Bible says about faith and baptism.

- Faith and baptism are linked to salvation (Mk. 16:15-16).
- Faith, repentance, and baptism are for remission of sins (Acts 2:38).
- All those who believed and were baptized were added to the number (Acts 2:41).
- Paul was baptized to wash away sins (by the blood of Christ) (Acts 22:16).
- In baptism, we are united with Jesus in the likeness of his death, burial, and resurrection (Romans 6:3-4).
- God clothes us with Christ's righteousness at baptism (Gal. 3:27).
- We are raised up with Jesus in baptism (Col. 2:12).
- We are spiritually circumcised in baptism (removal of sins of the heart) (Col 2:12).
- In baptism, we are raised up with Jesus (Col.3:1).
- We are saved by baptism through the power of the resurrection (1 Pet. 3:21).

Some Jewish leaders believe in Jesus but did not confess him because they did not want to be put out of the synagogue. Scripture said they believed. Were they saved? Is

the implication that mere confession would have saved them if we conclude they weren't (John 12:42). Jesus conclusion was that they loved the praise of men more than the praise of God (John 12:43). Is it possible this same scenario holds true today for some religious leaders? (Read Luke 7:29-30) How do we acknowledge God's way is right today?

Doug's Discussion

Strange Things Are Happening Here

I noticed a hole in one of my t-shirts the other day. I suppose I shouldn't be surprised – most of those things are from college and that was almost two decades ago. The surprising thing is that so many of them have lasted as long as they have. I wish my shoes would make it that long. I must be harder on those . . . if I get three years with the shoe still intact I feel fortunate indeed. Imagine how impressed I would be if the next pair I bought for everyday use made it until I was eighty! At that point I think I would have to wonder if something abnormal was going on. Maybe my wife is replacing them with the exact same shoe every year just to mess with my head. Normal shoes simply don't last forty years.

This is the conclusion the Israelites were meant to discover for themselves. Not that their wives were being tricky, but that something more than natural causes were at work. "During the forty years that I led you through the desert, your clothes did not wear out, nor did the sandals on your feet . . . I did this so that you might know that I am the Lord your God" (Deuteronomy 29:5-6). Forty years of invincible clothing is supposed to lead you to the conclusion that God is and that He is taking care of you. Any time they doubted these things all they had to do is look down at their shoes. "Oh yeah, I've been walking twenty years on these things and not one broken strap. That's definitely not normal. Thanks God."

Perhaps we don't have quite such an obvious sign, but haven't you noticed some strange things going on? Take a minute to think about it. Ever had a Bible verse come to mind right when you needed it even though you haven't read that verse or thought about it for months? Ever "randomly" run into a friend on the day when they most needed encouragement? Ever get a call from your mom right in the moment when your willpower to resist some temptation had run out? I'm telling you – these things may not rise to the level of forty years on one pair of sneakers but I still think there's some unusual things going on. There comes a point where these providential events are too hard to explain away as coincidence. There is a point when we know that Someone above us is the Lord our God.
