



Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery

BAPTISM

The word "Baptize" (verb) or "baptism" (noun) is used in the New Testament over one hundred times. Thousands of people were baptized in the first century. This subject, therefore, is very important in reference to our covenant relationship with God.

The Greek word *baptize* that is used in the New Testament is transliterated with the English word "baptize." In a transliteration, the equivalent sounds of the Greek letters are brought over into the English language. *Baptize* was thus transliterated, "baptize." The original definition for the word *baptize*, however, is "to dip, plunge, immerse, or overwhelm." The most common definition is "immerse." Therefore, when the words "baptize" or "baptism" are read in the English Bible, immersion is the primary meaning that must be understood. When people were immersed in the first century, they were immersed in "much water" (John 3:23).



Because the Greek word *baptize* was not translated in early editions or the New Testament, many religious groups today have the practice of sprinkling or pouring and calling it baptism. They are sprinkled, either infants or adults, and then taken the words "baptize" or "Baptism" from the New Testament and applied them too what they presume to be an action that is sanctioned by God. In doing this, they have affirmed that individuals have been properly baptized, though they have not. This is an unfortunate practice by many religious groups today.

Throughout the New Testament, six baptisms are mentioned. (1) John's immersion (baptism) unto repentance (Matthew 3:11; Mark 1:4). (2) Immersion into the responsibility of leadership (Matthew 20:22,23). (3) Immersion with the Holy Spirit (Matthew 3:11; Acts 1:5). (4) Immersion with fire (Matthew 3:11). (5) Israel's immersion in the cloud (1 Corinthians 10:1,2). (6) Immersion in water for the remission of sins (Acts 2:38). When Paul wrote the Ephesians letter in A.D. 62, he proclaimed that there was only one immersion at that time (Ephesians 4:5). This is the immersion in water for forgiveness of sins which we are to obey today.

Doug's Discussion

They're Out There - Find Them

Part of looking for something is the expectation that you're going to find what you're looking for. Without this expectation it doesn't make much sense to be looking in the first

place. Think about it: let's say I loose my keys. I know they have to be in the house somewhere because I just had them yesterday. If I look in enough places I know I'll find them . . . eventually. That fact gives me all the encouragement I need to keep looking. But what if I'm looking for something that may or may not exist? Like . . . looking for precious metals in my yard with a metal detector. Admittedly, I highly doubt there is any so I'm not going to look very hard.



I think this effect makes a difference in how hard we look for lost people. How deeply we believe they are findable changes the intensity of our search. Comments like "people just aren't interested in the gospel anymore" surely come from people who aren't looking very hard. Why would they? In their minds finding someone to bring to Jesus is a lost cause. But what if you believed that, even in this crazy world, there was someone out there who would respond to the gospel? What if you believed that if you just keep on looking you would eventually find someone ready to hear the saving message of Jesus Christ? Yes, it might take a lot of looking. Yes, the search might not be easy. But what if you think that if you just keep at it one more person would eventually go from being lost to being found? I suggest that believing these things would lead you to look a lot harder than the "oh, no one cares for Jesus anymore" guy.

I personally don't think the world would still be here if there was no one left willing to accept the gospel. Jesus taught "this gospel of the kingdom will be preached in all the world as a witness to all the nations, and then the end will come" (Matthew 24:14). We're still here, so I'd say there must be some person in this world still waiting to hear. Some-one who would believe and obey if only someone would tell them the truth. My guess is there's actually MANY people of whom this is true. So enough with our half-hearted searching! Seek and ye shall find! That person is out there and you just might be the best person there is to reach them. But only if you keep looking.
