

Doug's Discussion

Most Doesn't Work

When I was a boy I had a paper route. I was responsible for delivering sixty papers or so to my neighborhood, and for my troubles of avoiding German shepherds and the neighborhood gang I was paid fifteen dollars a week. Today I wonder what I was thinking – but back then it seemed like a fortune. I wonder, however, if I would have made that

fortune if I decided to skip the house with the German shepherd who wanted to eat me. Yeah . . . how about that one and the last few houses on the route? Sometimes it was hot out and I'm sure I wouldn't have minded quitting early. What if I delivered 56/60 papers every day? Would that work? I think not. Only a full commitment to the paper route will do.

Or how about this . . . let's say I'm making a lasagna. I work really hard on it. I buy the ingredients, I arrange it beautifully in the pan. Let's say I do every single step except the one where I put it in the oven to cook it. When I serve my gooey, raw creation how do you think dinner is going to go at the Wells house? My defense will be – but I did most of it! Think about all the things I did! I probably followed 95% of those instructions. But . . . all that won't matter while we're eating cereal for dinner. Only a full commitment to the recipe will do.

We understand the idea of commitment for so many things. Coaches aren't interested in players who are only going to follow some of their instructions. Teachers tend to not give passing grades to students who only do some of the homework. The girl who likes you changes her mind pretty quick when you only answer some of her phone calls. Right? Well . . . then let's apply that concept to following God's Word. "But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues in it – not forgetting what they have heard, but doing it – they will be blessed in what they do" (James 1:25). But not 95% of it. All of it. I'm sure some will say "Lord, Lord did we not do a whole bunch of things?" at judgment but it won't matter. They weren't committed to all, only some, and the result is a lukewarm mess. Following God in everything, in 100%, is the way to being blessed in what you do.

I'm sure the enslaved Israelites, were thrilled that someone was sticking up for them. But not for long - Pharoah's response was to make their slave labor a lot harder, and then the leaders go back to Moses and say, "may the Lord look on you and judge you!" But do you know this story? It gets a lot better.

When you decided to do what is right life might not get better right away. It might get worse. Telling your supervisor you're not going to be dishonest on your business reports anymore might lead to trouble at work. If you decided to start disciplining a child who you previously let do whatever they wanted...that's going to be a nightmare for a while. You start doing what is right - and things get worse. When that happens it's your job to power through. DON'T FOLD. If Moses did that the Israelites would never have been free. Stay on the right path. It will get better.
