Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery

WHO IS MY MOTHER?

Mother's Day can be a challenge for many. After all, some mothers do not want to be mothers but are one anyway. Some mothers have aborted their babies and regret it and others have disowned their children and do not care. Some women want to be mothers but for one reason or another cannot be one. Sometimes a woman becomes a mother and loves being one very much, but sometimes children are taken away from them by circumstances beyond their control or a child is lost to an early death.

Then there is the difficulty of children who want to honor their mother on Mother's Day but because of abandonment, abuse, or even death this is not possible, because a mother is not there.

This reminds me of little Johnny who was only 4 years old when he brought a baby chicken to his father's study. The chick had strayed from a neighbor's farm. The father said, "John, take that chicken back to its mother. It has no mother, replied Johnny. Well, Johnny's dad said well then take it back to his father. It has no father either, it has nothing but an old lamp.

An electrical lamp will hatch the egg and preserve the chick until it is old enough to face life, but that is about all. A child can sleep in a warm bed, receive nutritious meals, and nice clothing but still, fail to have the companionship and nurturing that only a mother can provide.

Regardless of the situation, Mother's Day can be a challenging and difficult day for some. If Mother's Day is a difficult day for you, let me point you to two passages of scriptures for some encouragement.

Notice Luke 8:19-21, "Then his mother and his brothers came to him [Jesus], but they could not reach him because of the crowd. And he was told, "Your mother and your brothers are standing outside, desiring to see you." But he answered them, "My mother and my brothers are those who hear the word of God and do it."

And then, Luke 11:27-28, "As he [Jesus] said these things, a woman in the crowd raised her voice and said to him, "Blessed is the womb that bore you, and the breasts at which you nursed!" But he said, "Blessed rather are those who hear the word of God and keep it!"

Did you notice that Jesus points to those who hear the word of God and do it as a true family! Now Jesus is not belittling his mother, after all the scriptures tell us nothing but good about Jesus' mother, Mary. But Jesus understood that human mothers and families for that matter were limited, many of us know this often too well. But Jesus teaches us that those who hear the word of God and keep it, are truly family.

There are all kind of reasons why mothers, fathers, and children let us down and even disappoint us, but as Jesus teaches us those who hear the word of God and keep it will have a family better than any physical family can offer. In fact, we will even be blessed when we hear the word of God and do it.

Zeal is Not a Dirty Word

When you first became a Christian do you remember being excited about your new faith? And why not? I would say crossing from death to life is a cause for some celebration! I would completely understand the desire to tell friends about how Jesus saved you. We want them to have this kind of joy and peace too, right? And I would understand wanting to worship God with some passion while at church. If you loudly and enthusiastically sing "Jesus saves" I get it, even if the people sitting next to you in the pew are giving you funny looks. You remember any of that excitement? Or better yet, do you still have it? I fear with many it tends to fade over time – and maybe you become the person giving the funny looks.

I'm sorry to say that I have witnessed places where enthusiasm is met with suspicion. A little bit of excitement and people start to wonder if you're one of "those" people. Apparently the fear of being one of "those" people becomes contagious because during worship the songs are sung with as little emotion and volume as possible. Somehow I don't think that's what God had in mind when He said "everything should be done in a fitting and orderly way" (1 Corinthians 14:40). On the other hand, what do you think God was talking about when he told the Ephesians "You have forsaken your first love. Remember the height from which you have fallen!" (Revelation 2:4-5)? Maybe a faith that began with excitement and joy fell into mumbled and half-hearted hymns.

Even as I write this I wonder if I just became one of "those" people in the minds of some. Well . . . it's worth it if one person decides to renew their zeal for the Lord. "Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervor, serving the Lord" (Romans 12:11). Don't be afraid to be like the guy building the wall of Jerusalem who "zealously repaired" (Nehemiah 3:20). If anyone got grouchy with him it was only because he was making them look bad. Don't be afraid to be heard from across the church building because you're so excited to be singing praise to God. Don't be afraid to smile as you remember that this is the day that the Lord has made. And when you meet someone who has a little of this kind of thing happening in their life "do not quench the Spirit" (1 Thessalonians 5:19). Zeal is not a dirty word.

Spiritual fervor is not worth a dirty look. Those who know they are cleansed desire to, and should, celebrate.

In Palestine there are two seas that are mentioned in the Bible-the Sea of Galilee and the Dead Sea. The Sea of Galilee is fed by the Jordan River and the Jordan River flows out of it. This water system supports many fish and supplies fresh water to thousands of people even today. The other sea is the Dead Sea, it receives its water from the Jordan River, and this is where the Jordan River ends. All the water that collects in the Dead Sea ends there and no water flows out, and no fish can live in its water.

These two seas remind me of two types of people: Some people are like the Sea of Galilee and receive many blessings and pass them on. In keeping with the Bible, they understand it is more of a blessing to give than receive. On the other hand, there are some people who are like the Dead Sea always taking but never giving. Ask yourself, which of these two seas am I most like?

Acts 20:35, "In all things I have shown you that by working hard in this way we must help the weak and remember the words of the Lord Jesus, how He Himself said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive."
