

Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery

We need fathers!

The TV show "60 Minutes" ran a segment that revealed some disturbing news. Park rangers at a South African wildlife preserve were concerned about the slaughter of 39 rare white rhinos. It turned out that the rhinos were killed not by poachers but rather by juvenile delinquents.



You see the story began a decade ago when the park could no longer sustain the increasing population of elephants. They decided to control the herds by killing many of the dominant males whose young were old enough to survive without them. As a result, many of the young elephants grew up fatherless and without the presence of male leadership.

As time went on, researchers observed that many of these young elephants began roaming together in packs and began to do things elephants do not normally do in nature. They threw sticks and water at the rhinos and acted like neighborhood bullies - knocking down trees, threatening the females, and basically raising the noise level and anxiety in the park. Without dominant males in the tribe, the young bulls became sexually active, producing excessive testosterone and exhibiting overly aggressive behavior. A few young males grew especially violent attacking non-aggressive rhinos and stepping or kneeling on them, crushing the life out of them.

To swell the destruction park rangers eventually had to kill the gang leaders leaving the young elephants disoriented and confused. Park rangers theorized that these young teen-aged elephants were acting badly because they lacked a dominant male role model. They eventually devised a solution and brought in a large dominant male to lead them and to counteract the abnormal behavior. After a few years of the new male leadership, the young bulls returned to their natural role in the tribe. The killings stopped and the wildlife preserve was saved.

You see the same is true in our homes, as it was with the elephants in Africa. We take the fathers, out of the home whether by producing illegitimate children, divorce, or having fathers who are never home for their children, too busy, working too late, and never providing a presence nor an example in the home. We get disaster.

We need to come back to what the Bible teaches us about fatherhood. This begins with fathers getting involved with their families and following the teachings of the Lord.

- Eph 6:4, "Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord."
- Pro. 4:1-2, "Hear, O sons, a father's instruction, and be attentive, that you may gain insight, for I give you good precepts; do not forsake my teaching."

If you are a father, following what the Bible teaches, and are involved with your children then may God bless you! We need you to keep doing what you are doing. Thank you, Mark T.

Doug's Discussion

Misunderstanding Love

I wonder how many tearful children have looked up to their parents after being disciplined and said "You don't really love me!" Must be a lot, right? A little bit more maturity is required to be able to understand that the discipline was in fact an act of love. "No discipline seems pleasant at the time, but painful. Later on, however, it produces a harvest of righteousness and peace for those who have been trained by it" (Hebrews 12:11). We've all seen how fun a child with no discipline can be (and I don't even blame the child for that). Parents who truly love the child make it clear that some things are wrong and lead to bad consequences.

God's love can be misunderstood as well. Have you ever pictured God like a grandpa? My grandpa was all business but I hear some grandpas get all squishy around their grandkids. They can do no wrong, no matter how much mischief they get into. Is that the love of God? All smiles and sunshine no matter what we do – perfectly accepting of all our ways with the only consequence of our actions being two scoops of ice cream with chocolate on top? I'm sure that sounds like a wonderful idea to some, but I think that's a misunderstanding of what God's love means.

When we are young we might not realize that how much we enjoy our childhood can be very connected to our actions. Two different kids in the same house have two very different impressions of their parents. One finds them to be wonderful, a source of one blessing after another. The other thinks the parents are awful. "They never let me do anything!" Same two parents who love both children equally. What's the difference? I'll tell you – one child was dedicated to doing what is right and the other pushed the boundaries at every opportunity. Love leads to different responses to different people, depending on what they do. About God the Word says, "To the faithful you show yourself faithful, to the blameless you show yourself

blameless, to the pure you show yourself pure, but to the crooked you show yourself shrewd. You save the humble but bring low those whose eyes are haughty" (Psalm 18:25-27).

God's love is always there. How you experience it depends on you.
