# The Crisis of Bereavement

Since death pierces every mortal, it is necessary for all of us to learn how to handle bereavement. I have watched with great admiration and respect the courage that has borne many a saint through hours of sorrow. Here is some practical advice I have seen others use in dealing with grief.

**Express your emotions.** Since Jesus wept, it should not be considered a Christian virtue to be unmoved by the loss of a loved one. There is a difference between suppressing one's emotions and self-control. The Bible does not say, "Sorrow not," but says "Sorrow not as others who have no hope" (1 Thess. 4:13).

Seek the aid of your friends. The very presence of friends is an encouragement. When Paul headed toward Rome, the brethren came to meet him and he "thanked God, and took courage" (Acts 28:15).

**Express your feelings in words.** Talking about it will help you to accept it. If this is done at the outset of bereavement, one will sooner be able to stabilize his life.

**Avail yourself of spiritual resources.** Even though you may not have realized the importance of the scriptures and their comfort, now these can help in building your faith. The power and peace of God are precious possessions.

Don't brood over what might have been. Both Mary and Martha said, "If Thou had been here, my brother would not have died" (John 11:21, 32).

Actively pursue worthwhile tasks. Once the initial shock has been dealt with, get busy at other things. Resolve, like Paul. To "Reach forth unto the things that are before" (Phil 3:13).

Make careful thoughts and decisions. Many an individual jumps hastily into deciding the full scope of the future rather than waiting until one has regained a proper perspective on life. Do not get in a hurry. Make prayerful decisions.

Increase your trust in God. Those who have come through their sorrow with a deeper faith can verify that God, who rules over all, truly does make all things work together for good (Romans 8:28).

After the crisis of grief, you can serve more fully and sympathize more completely with men of like passions. With Paul, you too can thank God for the comfort received knowing that it has now given you the ability to comfort others (2 Cor. 1:4).

# **Realizing Potential**

I have a child who wants to be a police officer. Another child wants to be a veterinarian. The other one wants to be a singing farmer. There is little doubt in my mind that all of them could achieve these things. My kids are smart and motivated. They have great potential. Of course, they might also be something else. Maybe one of them becomes a judge or an astronaut. There's potential for that too! I certainly pray that they achieve these things they want to do (or whatever the new plan is in a couple of years).

I'm sure if you have young children you have the same kind of hope. We pray they take all this amazing potential that they have and use it for good. If you're a Christian parent you probably have another hope as well. We're like the father in Proverbs who is speaking to his son, and we join him in saying "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your paths straight" (Proverbs 3:5-6).

Here's the thing: as cool as a singing farmer is, it is not as important as loving the Lord our God. What kinds of hopes and dreams do you have for your children? Is it your dearest hope that one day your child is a star on their team, and wins that trophy? How about wanting them to become a famous singer after winning America's Got Talent? Or maybe your dream is for them to improve their ACT score by two points so you don't go broke helping them through college. I don't know – we have all kinds of dreams. But none of them are as important as our children loving the Lord our God.

I'm happy for my kids when they come home from camp as one of the Bible Bowl winners. But more important than that is that they follow the Word they studied. I'll be happy if they get into the college of their dreams and become a leader in their chosen field. But more important is that they follow the leadership of Jesus Christ. If they win a race that's wonderful, but more important is winning the race toward heaven. If they achieve many great things

but fail in that way then really they have achieved nothing and failed to live up to their God-given potential. Think about that as you choose what to prioritize in your home, as you train your child in the way they should go.
