Don't forget to say "Thank You"

How many times do we tell our children to say, "Thank you?" For young parents with children, it may be a daily task, and the goal is to teach our children to show appreciation, respect, and gratitude for the things they receive. But how many times do we say, "Thank you?"

One man shares the story about a former teacher who taught him to appreciate the poet Tennyson. He decided to write her a little note of thanks. The following is the letter he received back from her read:

Dear Wille,

I can't tell you how much your note meant to me. I am in my 80s, living alone in a small room, cooking my own meals, and lonely like the last leaf of Fall lingering behind. You might be interested to know that I taught school for 50 years, and yours is the only note of appreciation I have ever received. Today it is a cold, blue morning, and your note has cheered me as nothing has in years.

Ingratitude, if you and I can feel let down and left out with ingratitude of the people

we serve and help. Can you imagine what the Lord feels like when we show Him little or no gratitude for what He has done for us?

In Luke 17:11-19, Jesus healed ten people of leprosy. Out of the ten people who were healed only one person returned to thank Jesus. What did Jesus think about that? Jesus asked, "Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner"



(Lk. 17:17, 18). With this comment, Jesus was expecting the other nine to also return and give Him thanks.

God expects us to be grateful and to express thanks to Him. The cross should compel us to give thanks to the Lord every single day of our lives for the great blessings that we received from the Lord.

This month as well as all the months of our lives let's give thanks to the Lord and to one another for all our spiritual blessings that we have received.

Doug's Discussion

Pie Crusts and Promises

Keeping a promise can be much more difficult than making one. That's probably why wise people have told me to be careful about what I say. Like Mary Poppins for ex-

ample. She once said, "that's a pie crust promise; easily made, easily broken." Despite being a fictional character she's not wrong about so many pledges people make. Easily made, easily broken.

Long ago Peter said to Jesus "Even if all fall away, I will not" (Mark 14:29). When challenged Peter said it even stronger: "Even if I have to die with you, I will never disown



you" (14:31). I figure that felt really good to say. Certainly it's the right thing to do. Think about all that Jesus did for Peter! Even if Jesus did much less I'm sure Peter would still want to be the kind of friend who "sticks closer than a brother." Unfortunately, these words brought Jesus no comfort. As the greatest prophet Jesus knew exactly what Peter would do – and it's not what he said.

I'm not really trying to be hard on Peter here. I understand. The promise Peter made in a moment of devotion was an excellent one to make. His difficulty was how hard it was to keep it. The soldiers were closing in. Then, even then, Peter was ready to fight to the death for His Savior. He drew his sword and started swinging. But, that was-n't the plan, so the sword was put away. Yet even then Peter hadn't given up entirely. He followed, at risk of his life, to see what would happen to Jesus. He was spotted. Fingers were pointed his direction. Shouldn't Peter be on trial too? Wasn't he one of the closest followers of Jesus? Finally it was too much, Peter panicked and denied the Savior, breaking his promise.

As I consider these things I am reminded how dangerous it is to make any promise at all. I am weak, sometimes without the strength to follow through on my good intentions. But if I do promise something I pray to God that I will have the strength to keep it. Lord, help me to be like you. You say "I will not violate my covenant or alter what my lips have uttered" (Psalm 89:34). I suggest a couple of guidelines so we can better reflect God's character. One: if we aren't sure we can keep a promise we shouldn't make it. Two: if we do make a promise we should keep it even if it costs us dearly. May our promises be carefully made and never broken.
