




Today's Sermon Notes

A.M. Sermon: Doug Wells Repent and Live

Scripture Reading: Ezekiel 18:30-32



Doug's Discussion

Who Told You Matters

The Israelites had a dangerous, unknown road before them as they traveled to the promised land. Fortunately, their God gives His people all that they need – in this case an angel was provided. Angels make excellent defenders against the threats they would face on the road. This angel would also serve as a guide, and apparently also gave instructions from time to time. The fact that this instruction came from an angel meant something. It wasn't just friendly advice that they could follow or not as they chose. No, words from an angel were expected to be followed. God says about the angel, "Pay attention to him and listen to what he says. Do not rebel against him; he will not forgive your rebellion, since My name is in him" (Exodus 23:21).

Angels had to be listened to. They also must be believed. Years later an angel appeared to old Zechariah. His wife was too old to be having children, but the angel said that didn't matter and they would have a kid anyway. Zechariah has doubts. But this wasn't just some random person telling him about his future status as a father – this was an angel! If you don't believe an angel there are consequences.



The angel says, "And now you will be silent and not able to speak until the day this happens, because you did not believe my words, which will come true at their proper time" (Luke 1:20). That is exactly what happened. Zechariah was mute until his son was born and named.

Let's face it – if you don't believe or obey a glowing spiritual being you have problems. That's a level of rebellion that is a step above ignoring parents or police officers. (And we shouldn't do that either). The Bible also speaks about a step above ignoring angels. Ignoring the gospel is even worse. So much so that the Bible asks "how shall we escape if we ignore such a great salvation?" (Hebrews 2:3). The gospel message is straight from God. And if ignoring an angel is bad . . . how much more is ignoring or disbelieving the Lord? The gospel of Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection was confirmed by eyewitnesses and testified to by "signs, wonders and various miracles" (2:4). The very best reasons are given to believe and obey. If we don't we can't expect to turn out better than those who disbelieved angels. But if we do we will have the joy of being led to the promised land.

Minute of Meditation by Mark Tonkery Heard on 910am WLTP

Was Jesus Christ born on Dec. 25? The Bible does not tell us. But what the Bible does tell us is that Jesus Christ was born of the virgin, Mary, in the town of Bethlehem, and angels announced His arrival. The shepherds went and found baby Jesus in a manger and sometime later wisemen from the east came and presented gifts to him. This really happened and Jesus was a real person.

But not only was he human, He was God, in the flesh, the Son of God. His name is called Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. He is the Lamb of God who came to take away the sins of the world.

Remember that Christ's sacrifice on the cross, and his resurrection from the grave could not be possible without His birth. Also, remember this, without His death, and resurrection we could not be born again of the water and the Spirit.

Bíble Call Report- November

Let us keep up the good work of calling and telling others about the Bible Call program. We had 197 Calls in November 2021. This represents 44 hours of teaching the Bible via this means. The high days were the 17th with 15 calls and the 19th with 13 calls. The most requested calls were for 950 (6) Exorcism and Demon Possession, 951 (7) The Kingdom and 1000-year Reign, (4) calls each on 112 God's Answer for Guilt, 113 Beverage Alcohol Destroys, 309 Why Be Baptized?, 507 The Ten Commandments, 601 When and Where did the New Testament Church Begin?, 910 Stealing and Cheating, and 913 Pornography.

Many calls were listened to more than once, two times people asked to hear a list of topics on the phone, and 14 times people listened to the lesson again. In these times that are so challenging we have an opportunity to reach into homes with the word. Other congregations are seeing this and starting mailing.

Let us continue to call daily, hand a leaflet to those you meet, and reach out to others personally and by mail. WHY NOT PUT IT IN MAIL YOU ARE SENDING OUT AND ALSO IN CARDS YOU SEND.
