Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery

Ideas on How We Can Use House to House, Heart to Heart (HTH) Magazine

Enclosed in this week's bulletin you will find an issue of the House to House, Heart to Heart (HTH) gospel magazine. It is sent out every two months. This paper is being sent out to over 1,000 homes in the South Parkersburg area as well as copies being sent to the church building. This paper can be a great evangelistic tool if we are willing to use it, but it must be more than sent to people's homes. The following are some ways we as members can use HTH:



- 1. Read HTH and answer the Bible questions in each issue.
- 2. Be ready to talk about HTH and answer any questions your friends and neighbors who receive it may have.
- 3. Place HTH in your work place, doctor's offices, and other places so more people can have access to it.
- 4. Pass HTH on to your friends and family.
- 5. Bible class teachers can use the articles and illustrations in HTH in their Bible class.
- 6. Couples and families can read HTH in their devotional time.
- 7. Take a HTH issue with you when you visit people in their homes or nursing homes and leave it with them to read.
- 8. Place a postage stamp on the HTH and mail it out to your friends and family members who do not live on mail routes where HTH is sent.
- 9. Go door-to-door and hand out HTH in your neighborhood on mail routes we have not mailed to.
- 10.Don't forget to PRAY to the Lord of Harvest for a greater harvest!

I have personally used HTH over the years in my ministry and I have seen unfaithful members come back to Christ, people from the community visit the congregation, people ask for Bible Studies and other Bible materials, and I have even had the opportunity to baptize people who were first contacted by HTH. If we put forth the effort HTH can be a great tool to help us carry out Christ's great commission (Mt. 28:18-20).

Lifter Of My Head

Having a nearby enemy is really no fun. We like to feel safe, and having a classmate or coworker who wants to harm us makes us mentally uncomfortable. Maybe they wouldn't physically hurt us – but having someone always on the lookout for ways to embarrass you or twist what you say is still tough. ONE person like that can make life much more difficult. Can you imagine if there were two? Five? What if everyone turns against you and you are rejected and despised by all? Perhaps you would then say along with David "O Lord, how many are my foes! How many rise up against me!" (Psalm 3:1). Even just a few people who would rather harm us than help us can be very discouraging.

For us to be free from fear we are going to have to have some kind of protection against our enemies. No, I'm not talking about knives or guns or bodyguards. Against a determined enough enemy these things only help so much. No, I want protection so good that I can be free from any anxiety at all. For that I must turn to the Lord. "I lie down and sleep; I wake again, because the Lord sustains me. I will not fear the tens of thousands drawn up against me on every side" (Psalm 3:5-6). Elisha was once surrounded by enemies (the story is in 2 Kings 6:8-23). His servant was terrified but Elisha wasn't concerned at all. Why? Because the Lord was with him. Thousands of well-armed soldiers were no match for the Lord.

What do you do when someone doesn't like you? Try to crush them before they crush you? Recruit people to your side through gossip and slander? That's a miserable

contest to be in. I would like to suggest a different coping method. First: pray to the Lord for deliverance. Plead with God to deal with the situation in whatever way is best. Then, trust the Lord's deliverance. There is no situation, no opponent, that the Lord cannot handle. Humble yourself before the Lord and acknowledge that He is better able to protect you than you are. Bow your head before Him and then He will lift up your head. "But you are a shield around me, O Lord; you bestow glory on me and lift up my head" (Psalm 3:3).

Contrary to a well-known children's song, words really can hurt. The results of angry and cruel words said to the people around us are obvious. We've seen the tears, we've seen the heads hung low, so most of us have learned to make some attempt to control our tongues.

But what about when you're saying words to those who aren't around you? Quite a bit of our communication these days happens on-line. How well do you control what you say on Facebook or Twitter? When you disagree with someone's post how do you react? Even though the actual person isn't right in front of you do you still know sometimes it's best to say nothing at all? Do you still realize that kindness is important? So many don't, and need to hear James 3:8-10: "With the tongue we praise our Lord and Father, and with it we curse human beings, who have been made in God's likeness. Out of the same mouth come praise and cursing. My brothers and sisters, this should not be."

Practice kindness in person, and practice it on-line too, and then we'd have less hurt people.
