The Amazing Brain

I am a terrible speller. In grade school, I dreaded the class spelling bees. It seemed like I always got the first word wrong and felt so humiliated as the rest of the class watched me go back to my desk and sit as they continued to participate; eventually, other students would join me, but it didn't make me feel any better. Any way spelling has never been "my thing" as they say, and I am very thankful for spell check on the computer but still, it doesn't get all the words I tend to misspell.

As I bemoan my lack of spelling ability, I was excited when I came across the following:

You might not realize it, but your brain is a code-cracking machine.

Scientists are not exactly sure why the brain can read misspelled words, but it is a reminder of how amazing our brains are designed.

In an article by Kyle Butt, he goes on to explain the following about the brain:

The brain is composed of over 10 trillion different cells. These cells work together to send electrical impulses at a rate of 273 miles per hour (393 feet per second). Nerve cells in the body send 2,000 impulses to the brain every second. These impulses come from 130,000 light receptors in the eye, 100,000 hearing receptors in the ears, 3,000 taste buds, and over 500,000 touch spots. As this is happening, the brain does not move, yet it consumes over 25% of the body's oxygen and receives 20% of all the blood that is pumped from the heart (which is pretty amazing, considering that the brain makes up only about 2% of the body weight of an average man).

And if all these "brainy" abilities don't impress you, consider that the brain serves as the "doctor" for the rest of the body. It produces more than 50 drugs, ranging from painkillers (like endorphins) to antidepressant drugs (like serotonin). In addition, the brain allows you to remember words, smells, pictures, and colors. In fact, the brain is so good at allowing a person to remember information, it has been estimated that it would require 500 sets of encyclopedias to hold the information found in the brain. <u>The Vine and the Branches</u>

Scripture Reading: John 15:1-5

Doug's Discussion

A Noticeable Difference

Once Egypt was cursed with a terrible plague of flies. I can only imagine how unpleasant that must have been – our family views ONE fly in the house as unacceptable. In the houses of the Egyptians there was more than one. Their houses will filled and their floors were covered. However, there was one area in Egypt where you could find relief. In the land of Goshen, where the Israelites lived, there were no swarms of flies, just as God said. "But on that day I will deal differently with the land of Goshen, where my people live . . . I will make a distinction between my people and your people" (Exodus 8:22-23). This was to be a sign to the Egyptians that God was in the land.

Differences between God's people and the people of the world give testimony to the existence and power of God. After the flies came the plague on livestock. This plague only affected the Egyptian animals. "Pharoah sent men to investigate and found that not



even one of the animals of the Israelites had died" (Exodus 9:7). If Pharoah didn't have such a hard heart that difference would have convinced him to humble himself before the Almighty God.

Does the power of God lead to any differences between His people and the rest of the world today? My answer is yes. Why are we a light to the world? Why are we the salt of the earth? Jesus would not have proclaimed these things if we were meant to be exactly the same. And what will happen if people see a true difference? What if people see that Christians are full of joy, and no amount of trials or persecution can discourage them? What if people see that Christians are faithful to one another, that their lives are full of good deeds and kindness, and that their love is pure and true? Then I would say (as long as their hearts aren't hard) that this would lead to people praising God. As Jesus says, "... let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:16).

It turns our that Christianity is good for you, and good for your kids. Aren't I Captain Obvious? Well, I suppose if you have been listening too much to certain atheists it might not be obvious. Richard Dawkins has claimed teaching children to accept their parent's religion is child abuse, suggesting it's even more damaging than sexual abuse. Interesting attention-grabbing statement - completely wrong.

If you look at Christian families with unbiased eyes it is easy to see how beneficial practicing Christian faith can be. If you need further proof, consider a 2018 Harvard Study. Researchers kept track of over five thousand youth for over a decade. Their findings? Young people who went to church and prayed were more likely to say they were happy, more likely to volunteer, and less likely to use drugs. The study's author, Ying Chen, said "Many children are raised religiously, and our study shows that this can powerfully affect their health, behaviors, mental health, and overall happiness and well-being."

I didn't need Harvard to tell me that but it's nice when someone sees the truth.
