Grief Support Class:

How many times have I heard those words, "after everybody went home"? That is when the harsh reality of death sets in. Life is hard, and it is often harder when a loved one dies. Home responsibilities change overnight. A rude awakening takes place concerning how much the deceased contributed to the family. One day you are accustomed to certain expectations and roles, and the next day everything has changed. I have often heard the days after death described in terms of resentment. For the living, everything changes. Not just a few things change, but everything changes. Life must go on for the living; but when everybody goes home, it is hard. These words from one preacher reminds us of the difficulty that comes when a loved one dies.

The bereavement and grief of a loved one who has died can last for a long time and sometimes a person might need the encouragement of others. This is why starting on Monday, March 7, 2022, and continuing on each Monday for 12 weeks I will be leading a Grief Support class here at Camden Ave. in room 119. Everyone is welcome. Each person is welcome to bring a friend or family member. The class will be discussion-based and will only last for an hour. If you have any questions, please contact Mark Tonkery. There is a sign-up sheet in the foyer if you are interested in taking the class.

Grief Support Class:

Who: Anyone who has had a loved one die at any time.

When: Mondays at 1:00 - 2:00 p.m. (Starting March 7).

Where: The Camden Avenue Church of Christ (Room 119)

What: We will be using the Bible and discussion to help people through the grief process.

How long: The class will run for 12 weeks.

Why: Sometimes people feel depressed, lonely, and have questions about death when a loved one passes away. It is during this time people need guidance from the scriptures about this topic.

They Like Us More Than They Think

We're not Christians because we want to be praised. We don't expect anyone to put us on a pedestal because of our faith. No, we want to humble ourselves and let God be lifted up. Which is good, because sometimes it seems like the world doesn't appreciate us at all! Ever walk into a room as one of those "Jesus people" and things get uncomfortable? People relax when you walk out? Once again – it's fine. We don't do this for the approval of men. HOWEVER – if people knew how much faithful people matter to their lives they might be singing a different tune.

Long ago merciful Abraham pleaded for the wicked cities of Sodom and Gomorrah. He was speaking with God and trying to figure out how many righteous people it takes to get a city spared. Some people think there were about sixty-five thousand people living in that area. When Abraham starts his plea he begins with fifty. "What if there are fifty righteous people in the city? Will you really sweep it away and not spare the place for the sake of the fifty righteous people in it?" (Genesis 18:24). That's a pretty modest request. "God, if fifty out of the sixty-five thousand people are decent – please don't wreck the place." That's 0.0007%! And it went down from there. Abraham "bargained" all the way to ten. For ten righteous people God would have spared a wicked city.

I have a theory. I don't think this world would be around if there weren't any righteous people in it. Jesus surely would return long before then. And if that's true then everything anyone has in this world and continues to have is, in a way, because someone is worshiping God. Wouldn't that be a different way of looking at Christians! Seen that way perhaps someone goes from being slightly annoyed at us to being extremely thankful. But even besides that Jesus says that believers are the "salt of the earth" (Matthew 5:13). As



in, we add some good flavor to the world around us. I can't even imagine how much believers, carrying the love of Jesus, positively impact those around them. Christians add kindness, save marriages, even influence society's laws in a positive direction.

No, we're not Christians because we want to be praised. But is the world a better place because Christians walk the earth? Yes. Are the fires held back because of the many righteous people who live here? Maybe. If only our critics knew! Someday they will . . .
