# Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery

## **OUR GREATEST NEED**

A teenager, tired of reading bedtime stories to his little sister, decided to record several of her favorite stories on his phone. He told her, "Now you can listen to your stories anytime you want. Isn't that great?" She looked at his phone for a while and then replied, "No, it hasn't got a lap."

We all need a "lap." We need people. We all need to be loved. God made us this way. God knew that people needed people. We need relationships to remain healthy. God made Eve for Adam because it was not good for Adam to be alone. Notice how Gen 2:18 reads, "The LORD God said, "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper suitable for him."

This is also why Jesus came to this earth. John 3:16 tells us, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son...." Jesus came as a person, not a principle. He came to get involved with people. Jesus healed people. He touched people. He listened to people, and He died and was raised from the dead for people (See Rom. 5:10).

The realization of Christ's love is not just seen in the gospel (1 Cor. 15:1-4) but also as we come together as the church. Hebrews 10: 24-25 explains, "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds. Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another--and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

# Doug's Díscussíon

## **Cautious In Judgment**

Okay, let's face it. People often make terrible judges. Now, don't get me wrong. I have great respect for those who sit on the bench and preside over cases. I pray God gives them great wisdom to administer justice and I admire their necessary efforts. But I'm not talking about Judge Judy, I'm talking people in general. We can think we're great at judging people and situations but there's a couple of big reasons why we're often wrong.

First of all, our judgements usually aren't purely based on the cold hard facts. Can you honestly tell me that part of your opinion on that guy over there isn't based on rumors? On what your friend thinks? You may have heard about something that he has done but do you know the entire context of the situation? Do you know what his motivation really was? How much of our judgment on anything is based on what we have personally witnessed and know for a fact (or at least beyond reasonable doubt) to be true? Take a moment with that last question and seek to be honest with yourself. Contrast this with God's judgment: "Now we know that God's judgment against those who do such things is based on truth" (Romans 2:2). Not rumor. Not personal opinion. Truth.

We also tend to make terrible judges because of a warped perspective. Unless we are without sin we should be careful about throwing stones because sin keeps us from seeing things clearly. "So when you, a mere man, pass judgment on them and yet do the same things, do you think you will escape God's judgment?" (Romans 2:3). Have you ever noticed that someone else doing some annoying or wicked thing seems so much worse to you than you do doing the exact same thing? It's fine when you do it but the other guy deserves public flogging. Contrast that with God's judgement. He is without sin so there is no selfishness to cloud His vision. There is no plank in His eye.

Are there times where you need to judge? Sure. Keeping ourselves and our children safe can require making a judgment call sometimes. Sometimes helping a brother or sister get out of some sin requires the same. Just be aware of the limitations of our judgment. We don't know everything and we can't see clearly even if we did. So as a general rule I would encourage you to accept this: "Mercy triumphs over judgment" (James 2:13).



## Mínute of Medítatíon by Doug Wells Heard on FM 96.9

One of the best pieces of advice you can give to a child before going into the woods is: if you get lost, stop and wait. Quit moving. The best chance you have for a rescue is to stay still and wait for it. But what if the kid tries to solve the problem himself? Then he's much more likely than not to go from being lost to being more lost.

I think we all face problems like this sometimes. Problems we cannot solve by our own wisdom or power. If we try we just make more of a mess than we started with. If we can't fix it, what can we do? I suggest being still and waiting for a rescue. As Psalm 37:7 says "Be still before the Lord and wait patiently for him."

Listen - God can fix what you cannot. Stop trying. Moving in a panic is just getting you more lost. Trade your anxiety for prayer. Then be still and wait patiently for your rescue. God can do more with His hands than you can do with yours.

I recently ran across this story called, "A Judge's Haunting Words" by an anonymous writer. "I went to Bible classes when I was small and learned all about God. After I was married I decided to go again and take my children. I couldn't persuade my husband to go, but the children and I went regularly for a year. Then I skipped a Sunday. And soon I skipped two or three. Then we went only on special days. Soon I joined a bowling team that competed on Sunday. I could go to worship and Bible classes, but I would have to give up bowling. Bowling won the battle.

Not long ago in a courtroom, I heard the judge say, "Twenty years!" He was pronouncing sentence on my 21 year old son for a robbery for which ended in the death of a man. The sentence might have been less, but my son took a sneering, defiant attitude all through the trial; ridiculing every officer and official in the courtroom.

But the crowning, shocking climax came when the judge sternly asked, "Young man, don't you believe in God?"

My son laughed and said, "God? Who's that?" Every person in the courtroom turned to look at me. If only I had those years to live over! I would attend Bible classes and worship services faithfully and make sure my children attended as well.

I wonder how many times parents have made this same statement? If only they could turn back the clock and put God first in their marriages and in their children's lives. In far too many cases the damages are already done. Make no mistake about it!

We are rearing a new generation of children who literally have no clue concerning God because the generation before them didn't teach them! Children will not on their own volition learn about the Lord. God places children in our care to bring them up "in the nurture and admonition of the Lord." (Eph. 6:4).

Parents must wake up before some judge places a jail sentence upon their children. We will all give an account to God one day for our young ones. If our children lose their souls for all eternity, we would feel terrible and yet, we can start by training them in the ways of God. We must begin with ourselves first!
