

Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery

Are you where God needs you?

Have you ever been somewhere you were not supposed to be? I was never one who would skip school. Even in college, I went to all my classes, except when I was sick and sometimes even then I still went to class. But there was one day, and the only day I ever remember skipping class to "goof off," and it was not really my choice.

This is what happened. During my freshman year, students from OVC were asked to go to Williamstown High School and judge a science fair. I was asked to go, and it required me to miss some of my classes that day, but they were excused during the time we were at the science fair. My one problem was I had no car, so I had to catch a ride with another student if I was going to participate in the science fair. So, I found a ride with a "friend" who was also in the classes I was missing.

The day came and we went to the science fair and completed our judging.

Once we got back in the car my "friend" who was driving decided to take a detour back to OVC. It had just rained, and he saw an empty parking lot and he thought it would be fun to try to hydroplane his car through the water puddles. Well, we did that for a while without any injuries or damages and then he took his time coming back to school. Once we came back to school, we returned to our classes, we had completed our service project and "extended" our free time, no harm done, right.

Wrong. When I returned to the one class I was excused from later in the week, the teacher called me out for "skipping" and did not excuse my absence. Apparently, my "friend" told the teacher about our "extracurricular activity" and informed the teacher that I was with him. We both received an unexcused absence from the class. I was so upset with that kid I hardly ever talked to him again, and I most certainly never rode with him anywhere.

Nevertheless, I was not where I was supposed to be and got "called out" for it. I guess maybe we all have at one time, or another been somewhere we were not supposed to be. Like Jonah. In Jonah 1:1-3, God calls Jonah to go to Nineveh, instead, Jonah goes to Tarshish.

Jonah does the opposite of what God tells him to do. Jonah did not go where God needed him. Jonah thought he could run away or hide from God. As we read the book of Jonah, we learn that Jonah was mistaken, by the way of a ship, storm, sea, and a great fish. Jonah finally ends up where God needed him, in Nineveh. If Jonah would have only gone to Nineveh the first time it would have saved him a lot of trouble.

Thinking about Jonah should make us ask the question are we where God needs us to be? Are we serving God, obeying God, and doing the things He needs us to do, or are we trying to go the other way? For example, when the call goes out that someone needs a visit from members of the congregation do we go visit or ignore the request? When there is a need for a Bible class teacher do you make excuses why you can't teach instead of going and teaching? Do you need to be in Christ, to repent and be baptized but delaying? When help is needed, a soul needs to be taught the gospel, or volunteers are needed, do you go and help or run away like Jonah?

Now is the time to act, and be where God needs us. Will we rise to the occasion? Will we act? Are you where God needs you?

Fight to the Death

Doug's Discussion

Terms and Conditions Apply

In America today I don't think it's super uncommon to run across the belief that everyone goes to heaven. I mean . . . have you ever been to a funeral where the minister suggested otherwise? Now, don't get me wrong, I would love for everyone to go to heaven. It's not like there's a shortage of room. But I don't want anyone to get a really unpleasant surprise before the pearly gates – so it's worth knowing that salvation of any kind tends to have conditions.

Take for example the agreement the Israelite spies had with Rahab. Rahab, a resident of Jericho, risks her life to hide the spies Joshua sent. She modestly asks in return that her family not be killed. That is, she wanted to be saved from the coming destruction. The spies agree: "Our lives for your lives!" (Joshua 2:14). Salvation was given – but it was conditional. The spies go on to say "This oath you made us swear will not be binding on us unless, when we enter the land, you have tied this scarlet cord in the window through which you let us down, and unless you have brought your father and mother, your brothers and all your family into your house" (Joshua 2:17-18). What do you think would happen if Rahab forgot to tie the cord to the window? What if she neglected to bring her family into the house? What if she said something like "you know, they have no right to decide how I live my life. I do what I want and they better let me do me!"? If that was her attitude I suspect this would have been the last we heard of poor Rahab.

Many other examples exist. Noah was offered salvation but he had to build a boat to gain it. The Israelites were offered salvation from the Egyptian army but they needed to take a probably unnerving walk between the separated waters of the Red Sea to be safe. And we too are all offered salvation in Christ from the coming destruction but this salvation is conditional as well. Those who wish to be saved must obey the gospel (see 2 Thessalonians 1:8), repenting and being baptized into Christ (see Acts 2:38), choosing to follow Jesus (see Matthew 26:24). The offer is for all. Obeying the gospel is the cord that God sees and spares the house, it is the ark that saves us from the devastation of the whole world.

I would love for everyone to go to heaven. But how could they without accepting the God-given conditions? Salvation has never worked that way before.
