## Church...Who's gonna fill their shoes?

A few years back, the late George Jones, one of country music's legends and a member of the country music hall of fame, made the charts with a song titled, "Who's gonna fill their shoes?" He was thinking about a vanishing breed of country music performers. He wanted to know "Who's gonna play the Opry and the Wabash Cannonball?"

The question George Jones asked about country music is a question that we should be asking as well when it comes to the preaching and teaching of the gospel of Christ and the work of the church. Who's gonna fill the preacher's shoes when he passes on from this life? Who's going to help keep the saved, saved? Who's going to put the hours into studying and "rightly handling the word of truth" (2 Tim. 2:15)? Who's going to "preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching" (2 Tim. 4:2)? Who is going to go forth and preach to those in lands beyond us (2 Cor. 10:16)?

Paul asks a similar question in Rom. 10:14-15, "How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching? And how are they to preach unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news!"

The church needs preachers. The Christian Colleges and Preaching Schools can only train those who are sent to them. Who are we as a congregation sending to be trained to preach? How are we helping those who are being trained to preach? Congregations need to realize the urgency of training men to preach. Paul teaches the great responsibility in training ministers in 2 Tim. 2:2, by saying, "and what you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses entrust to faithful men, who will be able to teach others also."

The task of training starts in the home with parents, in Timothy's case his grandmother and mother (2 Tim. 1:5) started teaching him when he was a young child (2 Tim. 3:15). The time to start training our young men to preach is now. Preaching the gospel needs to be valued and honored in the home and in the congregation. Not that we exalt our preachers or think of them as being great or superior to others, but as Paul states in 2 Cor. 4:7, "But we have this treasure in jars of clay, to show that the surpassing power belongs to God and not to us."

Preaching the Gospel! Have you thought about how crucial it is? It is alarming when there is a congregation or a Bible class without a teacher or preacher. When there is a void in the pulpit or classroom, there will be a void in the spiritual teaching and growth of the church. The need is so great that Jesus asks us to pray for more laborers. Notice how He puts it in Luke 10:2 "..., "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

Who's gonna fill the shoes of those who are preaching and teaching today? May we be praying earnestly for laborers and doing all we can to train faithful men to teach the gospel to others!
P.S. The question, "Who's gonna fill their shoes?" can be asked of our elders, Bible class teachers, missionaries, deacons, and every other worker in the church as well! "Who's gonna fill their shoes?"

## Doug's Díscussion

## Sometimes One is Better Than a Thousand

Not all time has the same value. That is to say, an hour spent in one place doesn't necessarily have the same value as an hour spent in a different place. I think we can probably all understand this to be true when we think where we would rather spend our time. How many hours of the workplace would you trade for one hour on the beach? Would you take ten minutes with your grandchildren over ten hours of television? And how much time would you give back to have one more conversation with a departed loved one? You see? Time is funny like that, we don't measure equal amounts
 equally.

With this in mind I think it's worth considering the most valuable uses of a limited commodity. "The length of our days is seventy years - or eighty, if we have the strength; yet their span is but trouble and sorrow for they quickly pass, and we fly away" (Psalm 90:10). As a general rule this is still true even in this age of modern medicine - a quick seventy or eighty years is typical. We certainly don't want to waste them! Yet waste them is what so many seem to be doing. Ten thousand hours spent pursuing a worldly dream or worldly glory can have even less value than a few minutes of something else. Ten thousand hours of a power struggle to determine "who's the prettiest" or "who's the greatest" or "who gets to call the shots" can, in the end, have even less value than a few minutes of something else.

I pray we all gain a heart of wisdom. Wise indeed was the one who praised God by saying: "Better is one day in your courts than a thousand elsewhere" (Psalm 84:10). Normally if I asked you "Would you rather have one day or a thousand?" I suppose the answer would be pretty obvious. You would take the thousand, right? But time is funny like that. In this case the day is better because the day was spent with God, and the thousand were spent apart from Him. I think at the end of our lives this will come into even greater focus. There will be many regrets about missed opportunities and foolishly spent days. But no one but the greatest of fools will regret the time they spent in the courts of God. The value of that time has been multiplied a thousandfold and more.

Friends, if your days have little value come to God and spend them with Him. Better is one day with the Lord than a thousand elsewhere.
