

Doug's Discussion

When NOT to Mind Your Own Business

In an individualistic culture like ours great value is placed on minding our own business. There is certainly some wisdom in this. One of the Proverbs says, "He who passes by and meddles in a quarrel not his own is like one who takes a dog by the ears" (Proverbs 26:17). I've never tried taking a dog by the ears but I imagine they don't like it – and people don't like it when you shove your way into their business. But how far should we extend this? Does this mean we should ignore everything everybody is doing because, after all, it's their life and not ours? I would suggest there are times when that's not wisdom.

Long ago two and a half tribes of Israel were sent away with Joshua's blessing. They had fought long and hard and it was time to go home to the land they had received under Moses. However, when they came to the Jordan they built an altar. When that happened the rest of Israel believed that the eastern tribes were in rebellion against the Lord's commands on where to offer sacrifices. And did they say "well, oh well. It's their lives and they can do what they want. Not really our business"? No, they did not. They got themselves together an army and they marched right on over to put a stop to the nonsense that they thought was going on. Now why would they do that? What they said when they got there helps us answer that question. The rest of the Israelites remind the altar building tribes: "When Achan son of Zerah acted unfaithfully regarding the devoted things, did not wrath come upon the whole community of Israel? He was not the only one who died for his sin" (Joshua 22:20). Or in other words, we know historically that when one person is doing what is wrong the people around him are affected. So don't you think that you rebelling against the Lord over there isn't going to ruin our day over here!

It turns out that the altar was completely innocent but the concern of the Israelites was valid. I think it was responsible of them to not mind their own business in this instance and make sure their brothers were still honoring the will of God. I also think the same principles apply today. Most of the time . . . sure, mind your own business. But what if (for whatever reason) you become aware of a moral or doctrinal failing in the life of someone in the church? Is that the right time to mind your own business? The struggling person might think so – but the truth is that the failures of an individual will affect more than just that individual. In a way the entire community is affected. About thirty-six men died when Achan hid some of the Lord's loot in his tent, along with his entire family later. If one of his sons had the courage to confront his dad's immoral behavior a lot of lives might have been saved. The same counter-cultural community-saving courage is called for today.
