Our family now has experienced our ninth graduation (not counting all the friends and family graduations we have been a part of). I have graduated four times counting my high school and my college degrees. My wife has graduated three times with her high school and college degrees. Then Bre our oldest daughter graduated from high school in 2020 and now our youngest Sami graduated this year in 2022.

If there is one thing, I have learned about graduations; they are a comma in time and not a period. They are a time to look back, and a time to look ahead. Graduation is a time of endings and a time of beginnings.

As graduates look back on their achievements, their learning, and how much they have grown. They must also be reminded to continue to set goals, move forward, and keep growing. It is said that the person who aims at nothing will hit it every time.

A college class was graduating on a hot and humid day. As the graduates walked across the platform and received their diplomas from the college president, he smiled, shook their hands, and said loudly, "Congratulations!" Then, in a much lower voice that could be heard only by the graduates, he would say, "Keep moving."

• Jud. 1:21, "keep yourselves in the love of God, waiting for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ that leads to eternal life."

Graduates, congratulations on your achievement but remember "keep moving forward"! Graduation is an end to one chapter of your life, but it is also a beginning to the next chapter of your life as well. Keep moving! Keep growing! Keep watching over yourself! Keep the things you have learned! Keep doing good! Keep



loving one another! Keep loving God! Don't stop. Don't stagnate. There is more to life than you have found thus far.

Doug's Discussion

Good Lives are Good All Around

Last Sunday a former professor of mine, Dr. Bruce Terry, came to visit and worship with us at Camden Avenue. It was wonderful to see him since he's always been such an inspiration and help to me in my efforts at ministry. You might not even believe the encyclopedia of Biblical knowledge in that man's brain. (After services a brother asked me a question about paradise and where in the Bible he could read more about it. I pointed out one reference and was about to look up more when I saw Dr. Terry walking by and had a better idea. "Hey Dr. Terry, where in the Bible can I find paradise?" I kid you not, off the top of his head he rattled off the exact number of New Testament references and exactly where they were – along with comments on proper interpretation of each. My teenager son helpfully said at lunch afterwards "don't worry dad, in thirty years you'll get there.") As you can imagine, having someone like that on speed dial has been a wonderful blessing in the life of a minister who runs into things that are too hard for him to understand all the time.

Before the sermon I took the opportunity to point out Dr. Terry to the congregation and share a little bit of how much of a blessing he is. In my estimation he has lived a good life, dedicated to God and His Word. Who knows how many people he has blessed with his time and knowledge? My guess is a lot. If fact, I imagine that is always the answer to the question: "how many people are blessed by a good life?" The delight of a godly person "is in the law of the Lord, and on his law he meditates day and night. He is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither. Whatever he does prospers" (Psalm 1:2-3). And, of course, a godly person knows that their prosperity (in whatever form that might take) is not meant to be hoarded. They share. "And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that having all sufficiency in all things at all times, you may abound in every good work" (2 Corinthians 9:8). You see? A good life is a blessing to many.

That being said, I suggest we all take every opportunity to encourage good lives. If a child excels in sports I promise you they will be praised (not that there's anything wrong with that). But what about the one who makes an extra effort to be the next Dr. Terry, spending time every night studying and memorizing scripture? I think, as a church, it would serve us well to praise these kind of accomplishments most of all. After all, their blessing will even be a blessing to us!
