
Results are long-lasting. Youth is the prime time for determining life's priorities. Knowledge of the Scriptures equips young people for Christian service throughout their lives.

Today's Sermon Notes

AM Sermon: Doug Wells
People of Babel
Scripture Reading: Genesis 11:3-4

1: Why do you think people build towers that reach into the heavens? Mark 13:1
2: Compare Genesis 9:1 and 11:2-4. Where is the conflict between God's plan and man's plan?
3: When people oppose God are they safer when they group with other people who are opposing God? Why or why not?
4: What similar strategy did God use to defeat the allied army opposing Jehoshaphat and the people gathered in Shinar?
5: How is the kingdom of Babylon like the people at Babel?
6: When God gives you a command, when should you stop?
7: What should you do if someone tries to recruit you as an ally against God?
8: When is it better to scatter than gather?
9: What good is a city and a tower if it is done without God?
10: What will you resolve to build instead?

Doug's Discussion

Guard the Weak Points

A wall was an excellent defense for a city in ancient times, but it did tend to have a weak point. I suppose it isn't practical to expect everyone to climb the wall on a lowered ladder, so there did have to be an opening for people to get in. How strong this opening was determined how difficult it was to get into the city. That's why people put a lot of time and effort thinking about how to reinforce gates. Multiple gate systems were used, there were openings to fire projectiles at people attacking the gates, sometimes there were even recessed rooms to house guards inside the gate complex. We can see the wisdom in guarding a city this way. Are we equally as enthusiastic about guarding our hearts? "Above all else, guard your heart, for it is the wellspring of life" (Proverbs 4:23).

Samson had a weak point. The first thought we have of him is perhaps his supernatural strength. However, as strong as he was, a woman defeated him because she knew the attack that would work. One thousand Philistine soldiers? Not a problem. Beautiful immoral woman who cares enough about money to maintain a sustained verbal barrage? Problem. "With such nagging she prodded him day after day until he was tired to death. So he told her everything" (Judges 16:16-17). If the man who could lift the city gates up a hill had a weakness I think it's safe to say that we do as well.

Let's take a minute and walk around the wall. Where are the gaps where the enemy is most likely to get in? Where are the doors that are easiest to kick down? If you are so proud that you think you are unassailable then defeat is assured. The wiser among us understand that there are weak points and they will take measures to defend them. What if



your weakness is you have a hard time picking virtuous companionship, like Samson? Then set a guard. Have a Christian friend or parent come along and get to know the person as well so you have an independent assessment. What if your weakness is spending money on frivolous things that you really can't afford? Then bar the gates. Chop up the offending credit card. You know you better than I do, so you know what kind of things will help keep the enemy from getting a foothold. You can save yourself a lot of pain when the attack comes by doing those things.
