A WATERSHED DECISION

In the Eastern Panhandle of West Virginia, there is a sign on Interstate 68 that reads, "Eastern Continental Divide." This is the place if water is dropped on the center of the Eastern Continental Divide, half would go east to the Atlantic Ocean and the other half would go west towards the Mississippi River and then into the Gulf of Mexico.

Sometimes the decisions we make are called "watershed decisions" because of their importance and the direction they set for the future. As individuals, we can make a watershed decision that can set the tone and direction for the rest of our lives.

John Powel, S.J. said, "Making a commitment...will mean for me that certain experiences, which might otherwise have been mine, are now impossible for me. The man who chooses one woman for his wife and life partner by his very choice has eliminated all other women as possible wives and life partners. It is this very elimination that frightens us on the brink of commitment. Every commitment is like every moment of life: there is a birth and a death in every moment. Something is and something else can never be again. There is a choice and surrender a "yes" and a "no."

Last Sunday I shared with the congregation a "watershed decision"; on Sept. 14, 2022, I will conclude my ministry here at the Camden Ave. congregation. Then on Sept. 18,

2022, I will begin working with the Norval Park church of Christ in Zanesville, Ohio. Laura, the girls, and I have been a part of the Camden Ave. congregation for almost six years, and we want to thank you for the experiences, fond memories, and the opportunity to be a part of the church family.

Our leaving is a voluntary choice. This decision is not an easy one to make and we ask for your prayers as we make this transition. Laura and I will be praying for the congregation here that the work will continue.

Doug's Discussion

Conflict Avoidance

There are some fights that don't make a lot of sense. Take for example that random guy who thought it was a good idea to taunt Mike Tyson on a plane. You know . . . the Mike Tyson who once had a video game named after him called "Mike Tyson's punch out." Well, after he got punched out I hope he reflected on his life choices. A better policy is to think about a coming or potential conflict to evaluate if it's a good idea to be a part of it. As Jesus teaches, "Or suppose a king is about to go to war against another king. Will he not first sit down and consider whether he is able with ten thousand men to oppose the one coming against him with twenty thousand?" (Luke 14:31). If the fight doesn't make sense the wise king seeks to avoid it.

Or you could choose to be like the tribe of Benjamin when they refused to give up the evildoers among them. Rather than submitting their brothers to justice they mobilized to fight Israel, and they assembled twenty-six thousand swordsmen. Not bad, right? Well . . . "Israel, apart from Benjamin, mustered four hundred thousand swordsmen, all of them fighting men" (Judges 20:17). 26K verses 400K doesn't look like much of a fight on paper. What would have been wise at this point? I think they should have looked at the field and given the men up. Instead they fought to the bitter end. They did much better than expected – but when all was said and done only six hundred Benjamite men remained. And what did they really think was going to happen?

Some fights just aren't worth it. I mean, if God wants you to do it that's one thing. Fight on, the odds don't matter. But not every crusade people go on is done at God's command. I've seen people get stubborn about all kinds of things, even something as small as the next color for the church carpet. You and a few of your friends want blue. Twice as many want orange. "But orange is a hideous color!" But friend, are you with your ten friends able to oppose the twenty who oppose you in this matter? Just let it go. The fight isn't worth it. Of course, there are much weightier matter than this. All I'm asking is that you be wise. Think it through ahead of time. What is likely to happen if you fight this out? Will the church be stronger at the end of the struggle? Will people be blessed? Or is somebody going to end up with a pointless black eye? "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called sons of God" (Matthew 5:9).
