The Night Billy Graham Led Someone to Christ

When I mention the name of the late Billy Graham, what comes to mind? A great preacher or a great false teacher? Maybe the following story told by J.M. Powell who once preached at the East Chestnut church of Christ in Ashville, North Carolina can give some clarity about Billy Graham.

Brother Powell was once preaching in Hamilton, New Zealand when he met a man by the name of John Gerrand. John was not a Christian when Billy Graham came to New Zealand to preach in one of his crusades.

Mr. Gerrand shares the following, "One night Billy Graham was preaching about repentance and cited Acts 2:38 as a proof text. He repeated only the word "repent." I was within a few feet of Mr. Graham and was reading along in my New Testament. When I read the rest of Acts 2:38, I stood up and asked Mr. Graham to quote the rest of the passage. Billy Graham became irritated with me and said, "Get out of here you church of Christ man."

Mr. Gerrand was just asking a question and wanted clarity but was rebuked for his question. Mr. Gerrand was perplexed. This was the very first time he had ever heard of the expression, "A church of Christ man." Mr. Gerrand was not even a Christian and he had never heard of the church of Christ.

As the story is told Mr. Gerrand went home, searched out, contacted the local church of Christ and was baptized into Christ according to Acts 2:38.

Mr. Gerrand became a Christian because Billy Graham rebuked him for reading and believing the whole verse of Acts 2:38, rather than just taking one word out of context. We can only imagine what could have happened if Billy Graham would have taught and believed the whole verse of Acts 2:38. Instead, Graham's negative response to Gerrand caused him to continue to search the scriptures that lead him to the truth and obey the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

The Apostle Paul states in Act 20:27, "for I did not shrink from declaring to you the whole counsel of God." We in the churches of Christ strive to teach the "whole counsel of God." We want people to understand the whole verse of Acts 2:38 as well as the rest of the Bible.


Doug's Discussion

We Still Follow

The call of Jesus to the disciples was relatively simple in nature. He would simply say "Follow me." Granted, it took enormous sacrifices to actually do but the concept was easy. Jesus goes to point A... you go to point

A. Jesus leaves point A and goes to point B... you go to point B. Along the way Jesus would give instruction that you may or may not understand... but that's okay. Keep following, and eventually you will. I suspect the instruction of "follow me" was deeply etched into the minds of all who heeded the call of Jesus of Nazareth.

It must have come as a shock when Jesus finally told his disciples that they wouldn't be able to follow Him. "My children, I will be with you only a little longer. You will look for me, and just as I told the Jews, so I tell you now: Where I am going, you cannot come" (John 13:33). Jesus says this, then says something profound about love. Guess what



stuck with Peter the most? He basically says "No, wait a minute . . . go back to that first thing. Where are you going?" Peter, no you can't follow right now. "What do you mean, why not???" Well . . . because Peter doesn't know what he's asking. To follow Jesus now would mean to follow Him to a cross, and Jesus is basically telling him that this is not Peter's time.

What does it mean to follow Jesus today? We no longer go with Him to point A and B as He walks on this earth. Yet, in a great spiritual irony, what Peter was denied is now the call of every Christian. Jesus says in Luke 9:23, "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me." We are all called to follow Jesus to the cross. It's our time to give up our own wants and desires and live (and if necessary die) for the Lord. Jesus' call still echoes through the ages: "Follow Me." Do you have ears that hear? I hope so, because we want to go where He has gone . . . even though it can take us a little while to get there.
