

Doug's Discussion

Empty Spaces

My children have just informed me that summer break is nearly upon us. They, of course, are overjoyed. All they have to do is survive a little more than a week of school and then in their minds a vast chasm of glorious free time awaits them. My feelings on the subject are a little more subdued. I think empty spaces in our schedules CAN be a wonderful thing. I suppose it really depends on what ends up filling that time. After all, something will. Vacuums tend not to exist for long.

Jesus tells a story in Matthew 12 about an evil spirit coming out of a man. That house becomes an empty space, "unoccupied, swept clean and put in order" (12:44). Clearly this man initially found relief. However, I think one of the points of this story is that he didn't fill his house with anything good after the spirit left. A bad thing out is good, but if you don't replace that bad thing with something good what do you think is going to happen? In this case the man ended up worse than when he started. "Then [the evil spirit] goes and takes with it seven other spirits more wicked than itself, and they go in and live there. And the final condition of that man is worse than the first" (12:45).

I'm not sure comparing school to a demon is a great illustration, even though I'm pretty sure I could find some students who would go along with it. But you get it – it's gone for the summer, and the schedule planner is empty. Or for the rest of you, the weekend is here – and there are hours of unclaimed time. Or wherever the empty space may be – it's up to you to intentionally decide what to do with it. What good thing are you going to fill that space with? As Titus 3:14 says, "Our people must learn to devote themselves to doing what is good, in order that they may provide for daily necessities and not live unproductive lives." But what if you don't? What if the schedule remains empty? Then I suggest the vacuum won't exist for long. If you don't choose for yourself something that is good to fill that time something else might choose for you. And I don't think that choice will be nearly as productive as a choice you intentionally make for the Lord.

MINUTE OF MEDITATION Heard on FM 96.9

<u>Differences in Hope</u>

I'm just going to say this bluntly: Apart from God, there is no guaranteed hope. Let's say someone has a dream to be healthy and financially secure. That sounds good, right? Sure – but no one is guaranteed these things. Even if you're healthy now it doesn't last. Neither does wealth. Proverbs 11:7 says, "When the wicked die, hope dies with them; their hope in riches will come to nothing."

You may have seen someone whose hope is crushed. People in the hospital who know they won't recover. People who put all their money into a home or business that lost its value. What a sad thing to see!

This works differently for a Christian person. They may end up in the hospital, and they may lose all their money. But someone of faith can go through these things and NOT be crushed. As one group of Christians is told: "And our hope for you is firm because we know that just as you share in our sufferings, so also you share in our comfort." We await the comfort of an eternity in the Father's arms. In Christ, the promise of that hope will NEVER come to nothing.

Afraid of Heaven?

After the lesson, she walked up, cradling her Bible, and said, "I can count on one hand how many times I have heard a lesson about Heaven!" Shocked and wide-eyed, I asked myself, "How could this be? This sister has been a faithful member of the church for a long time!" How could some avoid such a great topic? Through your own experience, I am sure you have learned that fear is a powerful emotion. Fear is so powerful that it can influence our thoughts and actions. We have learned that fear is not always a bad thing; fear can protect us from injury or even death. Tragically, we have also learned that sometimes we fear things we should not. Most people fear death for several reasons, some unique to their own. What does this mean for a Christian who fears death? Does this mean they are afraid of Heaven? As Christians, we look forward to our eternal reward. Are not our conversations dominated by what we most look forward to? Heaven should not only be taught in our services but also in our daily conversations. This thought also led me to realize that I have not heard many discussions about Heaven myself.

Why is this? The Apostle Paul wrote the following to the church in Philippi, "Finally, brethren, whatever things are true, whatever things are noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy—meditate on these things" (Phil 4:8 NKJV). The Apostle Paul tells us to meditate on these good things. Heaven is true, noble, just, pure, lovely, of good report, has virtue, and is praiseworthy. So, why are some not meditating on Heaven? Most people fear death, and I think this can be seen in some preaching and in some conversations by the avoidance of speaking on the afterlife. Do not be afraid of Heaven! "For to me, to live is Christ, and to die is gain" (Phil 1:21). Love the thought of Heaven so much that you cannot hold back

BIBLE CALL REPORT — APRIL 2023
