Jeanie sticks her fingers in her ears and cries, "Na-Na-Na-Boo-Boo, I can't hear you!" and runs off. Have you ever refused to listen to someone before? Luckily, her friend is in quick pursuit of her. There is something she must hear even though she is having so much fun being distracted on the playground. I remember doing this so many times as a child with my friends. The problem is that we can sometimes do this as adults.

In Acts chapter seven, we read Stephen preaching a solid message to the Jews concerning their sin and Jesus Christ. What was their reaction? "Then they cried out with a loud voice, stopped their ears, and ran at him with one accord" (Acts 7:57 NKJV). Sometimes we do not want to hear what must be said, and often failing to listen to the message can be intentional, as the little girl did earlier. <u>Reason met with Violence</u>

I once knew two brothers. Both were very smart, but one thought a lot quicker. So, what tended to happen was they would get into a brotherly argument, the younger brother would argue circles around the older, and then brother two would get frustrated enough to want to connect his fist to his brother's face.

This isn't the most uncommon of interactions. What do you do if you cannot answer the other person's arguments? You could accept the truth of what is being said, or maybe ask for time to do more research. But some just swing. In Acts 17 Paul went to Thessalonica and verse 3 says, "On three Sabbath days he reasoned with them from the Scriptures, explaining and proving that Christ had to suffer and rise from the dead."

Paul's reasoning was so good that people were convinced, which made some unhappy. They could not counter the argument for Jesus, so they went for option 2. Verse 5 says they "rounded up some bad characters from the marketplace, formed a mob, and started a riot in the city."

Speak the truth in love. If it gets met with violence that might simply mean there is no good reply, other than to accept it.


DOUG'S DISCUSSION

Sorry to See You Go

Sometimes, when someone is leaving, people may say something like, "We're sorry to see you go!" And that's right. Certain people are a delight to be around, so when they must go back home or back to whatever their regular responsibilities are, we do wish they could stay longer. But is it mean of me to mention that this isn't always the case? Bear with me here ... I don't like to be mean, but I think if we're going to be honest then we would admit that there are people who we aren't too sad to see walk out the door. Why is that? Well, some people are more difficult than others, even within the church. That's why verses like Colossians 3:13 exist: "BEAR with each other and forgive one another ... forgive as the Lord forgave you."

In Judah, one of the kings was quite a nasty man. He was a murderer. He was an idolater. He led the country into chaos – and then he became diseased and left the earth. And here is the sad way the Bible puts his passing in 2 Chronicles 21:20 "He passed away, to no one's regret, and was buried in the City of David." In other words, are people sad to see him go? No, they most certainly are not. He was nothing but trouble, he caused nothing but pain, and the people breathed a great sigh of relief when he was gone. In fact, his death led to a chain of events that would one day cause their lives to be considerably better.

Here is what I am suggesting: don't be that guy. Why be someone that makes people more comfortable when you LEAVE the room? And yes, I have talked to people who have lost loved ones who have admitted to me that the emotion that they feel most isn't grief, it's relief. They may feel guilty about it but that's the truth. The poor choices of the deceased individual had made life so hard that their passing made it feel like the people around them could breathe again. Don't be that guy! I'll still love you, being called to bear with you, but I think we should all make this easy on one another. Live a good life. Really love people. Then they will be sorry to see you go.


