They Díd and They Do

A person does what they do. I'm not sure how grammatically correct that statement is but perhaps it can be helpful to you as a proverb. People tend to be creatures of habit. If they have a behavior that they exhibit in one situation they are very likely to do the same kind of behavior in a similar situation. They do what they do. That's why observing a person's behavior is such an effective way of knowing what kind of person they are. As Jesus puts it, "...by their fruit you will recognize them" (Matthew 7:20). I'm not saying that people can't change for the better. Much of my ministry is designed to help people do exactly that, by the power of God! But I am saying, absent relying on that power (and absent genuine repentance), people do tend to be what they were yesterday. The fruit is who they are.

There is a great benefit to having our eyes opened to this reality. We can save ourselves from all kinds of pointless pain. Your sensibilities may, for example, be a little offended at reading a proverb like Proverbs 20:19 which says, "A gossip betrays a confidence; so avoid a man who talks too much." Wait a minute, avoid him? We're supposed to avoid people? That doesn't seem right! Well . . . you should certainly still be kind. But welcoming someone with the unrepentant fruit of gossip into your close friendships is asking for pain. How do you know he gossips? Maybe because when you had him over for lunch, he spent the time talking about the annoying habits of another church member. "But wait – he would never say those kinds of things about me to someone else, I'm his friend!" And that's where you're almost certainly wrong. A person does what they do. You'd be better off hearing and following the wisdom of God.

How many times must we hear this story before learning the lesson? A person who cheated on their spouse is invited into another home. The next person tells themself "It would never happen to me!" But they are probably wrong. A person does what they do. Should we be gracious and forgiving toward people who make mistakes, knowing that we have made plenty ourselves? Absolutely. And we should also be wise. Jesus said to those He sent out, "...be as shrewd as snakes and as innocent as doves" (Matthew 10:16). That remains good advice today. Love people. Kindly encourage people toward God, who changes hearts. AND be shrewd enough to expect that, until evidence of new, spiritual, repentant fruit appears on the tree, people will continue to do what they do. "A gossip betrays a confidence." That's what they do.

MINUTE OF MEDITATION Heard on FM 96.9 <u>Redirecting Missiles</u>

I hear stopping missiles is important, and I believe God can do it. After all, that's basically what he did in the Bible in the case of Saul. Saul was attempting to crater churches wherever he went. He had just launched again, aimed this time at Damascus. The Christians there were hiding in shelters somewhere, bracing for the coming destruction. But before Saul can land Acts 9:3-4 tells us that a light from heaven dropped him right to the ground.

Modern warfare puts a lot of effort into doing what God did so easily. But what God did was a step above. It wasn't JUST that the missile was intercepted. God REPURPOSED it and sent it back toward the original target. Starting at Acts 9:19 the story goes: "Saul spent several days with the disciples in Damascus. At once he began to preach in the synagogues that Jesus is the Son of God." The enemies of Jesus are blindsided, their arguments destroyed by God's new instrument of spiritual war.

I think the lesson is this: don't fight with God. He can send your weapons right back at you.


