Doug's Discussion

Maybe Not the Worst

What we think is the worst thing imaginable might not be what we think. After all, our wisdom is limited. We are not God. We cannot see how the future will play out in every scenario. Maybe something that seems terrible now actually saves us from something much worse later. I often wonder this when I can't find my keys. I really hate not being able to find my keys. But what if those five to fifteen minutes spent finding my keys saved me from getting into a car wreck or hitting a deer or something? I won't know this side of heaven if that was ever the case, but I acknowledge that it is certainly possible. Since I don't know I'll just have to let God take care of that sort of thing, even if the situation I'm in right now isn't something I like. It could be worse.

Hezekiah once "became ill and was at the point of death" (2 Chronicles 32:24). This is probably the worst thing many of us can imagine . . . but is it? If Hezekiah dies he goes to heaven, with an incredible legacy of godliness. But death is just so hard for the king of Judah to face, so he prayes bitterly, citing all that he has done for God as a reason why God should spare him. And God does – He adds fifteen years to his life. Of course, fifteen years later Hezekiah dies anyway. But consider some of the things that happen that tarnishes Hezekiah's legacy in those fifteen years. For one thing, the next verse says, "But Hezekiah's heart was proud and he did not respond to the kindness shown him; therefore the Lord's wrath was on him and on Judah and Jerusalem" (32:25). For another, in those fifteen years Manasseh is born, who becomes the

next king. He is one of the worst kings ever. He fills the streets of Jerusalem with innocent blood. Hezekiah also makes the mistake of showing Babylon all of Judah's treasures during this time. Years later they come back to forcibly get them, and when they do, they basically wipe out the country. This all makes us wonder . . . would dying fifteen years earlier really have been the worst thing?

I think the best thing for us to do is to "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding" (Proverbs 3:5). We just don't know. I might really hate being in some kind of pain right now. I have no idea what the reason is for it and no idea why God won't immediately take it away. But what if some pain today keeps me from a much worse tragedy tomorrow? If I later see that is true won't that make me feel silly for complaining? I can just imagine God patiently explaining to me in heaven: "Doug, you needed that painful experience to help you be the kind of person I wanted you to be. If you didn't go through that you wouldn't have made the same choices, and you wouldn't be here today. Now, aren't you glad I didn't agree to take that away?" And, of course, on that day I'll say, "Absolutely Lord. Thank you so much for saying no to me. I thought what I was going through was bad but it could

have been worse!" We will see clearly then. I hope, in difficulty, we can

at least see the possibility today.

CURRY CONNECTION

Faith Cometh by...

We all know this Scripture. The preacher says it every single Sunday after every single lesson. "So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God" (Rom 10:17 NKJV).

I hope you are blessed to have a friend. However, have you ever had a friend ignore you? It hurts if anyone ignores you, but the pain is sharper when it comes from a friend. I remember the last time a friend began ignoring me and my family. It hurt, and I wanted to know why she was ignoring us. Did I do something wrong? Was she upset with me or my family? I couldn't get her to listen long enough to me to be able to answer any of these questions. It appeared like she no longer cared about us because she refused to listen to us anymore. It hurts to feel ignored.

The truth is that a friend that ignores you is not a good friend or a friend at all. We might have a sense of how God must feel as the world or even His church refuses to listen to His word. The Scripture above states, "hearing," not heard. Shouldn't that imply that we are to continue hearing for faith to continue? Yes, we cannot stop hearing the commands of Jesus and expect to continue being His friend. "You are My friends if you do whatever I command you" (John 14:15). A friend who is ignoring you is not a friend. Let's not treat our friends that way. Do you STILL have a friend in Jesus? Listen to Him through your study of God's word and refuse to ignore the Lord.

Scriptural Authority


