DOUG'S DISCUSSION

<u>Despíte Fear</u>

Do you ever view the characters of the Bible like they are superhuman? "Oh, well of COURSE he's going to lead those people out of Egypt. He's MOSES!" Or maybe, "I'm sure dealing with an entirely wicked world while building an enormous ark was no problem for that guy, he's NOAH!" Well . . . yes. They were incredible men. I would never dispute that. Righteous examples for the people of their time and every time. However, there's no reason to believe that their spiritual accomplishments were easy for them, or that they were immune from the struggles and temptations that the rest of us endure just because they were biblical heroes. Perhaps being a hero isn't about being above it all, but about doing the right thing despite what's going on around you.

When the Israelites were returning from exile, they were entering a precarious situation. The idol worshipers around them were no fans of giving glory to the one true God. But Jeshua and his fellow priests heroically decided to not let that stop them: "Despite their fear of the peoples around them, they built the altar on its foundation and sacrificed burnt offerings on it to the Lord, both the morning and evening sacrifices" (Ezra 3:3). Notice that it doesn't say they had no fear of the people around them. They did fear them ... for good reason. These people would bully and harass them for much of the rest of this book. But, despite this fear, they followed the law and obeyed God.

I pray that your faith grows to the point where you have no fear of men at all, knowing that all they can do is kill the body. I pray you faithfully know, eternally speaking, this isn't much of a concern at all. Those of us who have not achieved this level of spiritual enlightenment are left with a choice when those around us do not approve of God's ways. We could live in fear of them, and conform with the world. That's not very heroic though, is it? I prefer following in the footsteps of those who lived for God despite their fear. Whenever righteousness seems easy for someone it's probably because they've been practicing it for a long time. They could tell you about days when they had a choice whether to give in to fear – and they chose God. May we make that choice as well.

<u>The Fool Doesn't Listen</u>

Hello everyone, some religious guy here on the radio again with a message you may or may not agree with. After all, we don't all agree on everything in this country, do we? No . . . we do not. BUT – that doesn't necessarily mean the people with whom we disagree have nothing useful to say. In fact, they might have something to say that we really need to hear.

No – do NOT reach for that volume knob! Seriously, what if I was about to say something that would change your life or at least broaden your perspective? Unless you took the time to listen I guess you wouldn't know. And that's where I think we get ourselves into a lot of trouble. Proverbs 18:2 says "A fool takes no pleasure in understanding, but only in expressing his opinion."

We don't all agree, but what if we actually listened to one another? What if we sought understanding and tried to hear where the other person was coming from? Then maybe our deeply divided land could start to come together. Maybe then we could be wise.

CURRY CONNECTION

Conversion of the Ethiopian Eunuch (Acts 8)

To be pleasing to God, we need to know what pleases God. We get to know God through His word (1 Cor 2:10-12; 1 Thess 2:13). The ones who have pleased God are the ones who have searched His word. The Ethiopian Eunuch appeared to be a man willing to serve God due to his taking the time to study the Scriptures. He was reading the book of Isaiah as Phillip approached (Acts 8:30). It is a necessity for a child of God to be willing to put in the time to study God's word. How many today are eager to study the Scriptures, attempting to show themselves approved to God (2) Tim. 2:15)? When a person studies and can appropriately divide the word of truth, he can then teach others also (2 Tim. 2:2). Philip teaches the Ethiopian Eunuch, giving him the opportunity to hear and believe the Gospel (Acts 8:35). The Ethiopian Eunuch after having Jesus preached to him confessed, "I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God" (Acts 8:37), then was immersed in water to be baptized (Acts 8:38). After this was completed, the Ethiopian went away rejoicing (Acts 8:39). I remember the same joy and relief after I was added to the church of Christ!

The Ethiopian Eunuch's actions after Phillip preached Jesus from the word (Acts 8:35) teach us what preaching Jesus involves. This account has several essential steps because of the preaching of Jesus by Phillip: hear, believe, confess, and baptize. Repentance is not directly named here but is no less critical. When we study the complete word of God, we continue to see the true biblical pattern to salvation: to hear, believe, repent, confess faith in Jesus Christ, be baptized for the remission of sins, and remain faithful. After these steps are completed, we also can go our way rejoicing.


