

Doug's Discussion

Slow and Sudden Judgment

I suspect that the way people perceive the speed of the judgment of God varies wildly. For righteous people living in hardship, who notice the wicked living carefree, that judgment can seem very slow. This can even test their faith. One believer admits: "But as for me, my feet had almost slipped; I had nearly lost my foothold. For I envied the arrogant when I saw the prosperity of the wicked" (Psalm 73:2-3). The righteous wait and wait and sometimes it seems like nothing happens to those who openly defy God. At least, not for a long time. However, to those who are doing the defying, I suspect judgment seems very sudden. I have a feeling many unrighteous people believe it comes out of nowhere. Here they are, minding their own business, and WHAM! Whether you see it as slow or fast can depend on where you are standing when it happens.

In Israel, judgment may have seemed slow to the prophets, especially to those who were greatly persecuted by their own people. "The Lord, the God of their fathers, sent word to them through his messengers again and again, because he had pity on his people and on his dwelling place" (2 Chronicles 36:15). These messages were given over years and years, by several prophets. Some were ridiculed, some were even killed for their warnings. Judgment came slow . . . until it didn't. Finally, one day, time was up. "He brought up against them the king of the Babylonians . . . God handed them all over to Nebuchadnezzar" (36:17). The city was destroyed, and the people were killed or captured. And maybe on that day, the people were shocked that such a thing could happen. What's the deal God? Nothing like this has happened before! No, but their defeat didn't really come out of nowhere, even if it seemed that way to some. This terrible day was the result of years of wickedness. Slow . . . then fast.

Jesus tells us that life will go on as normal until the day He comes back, and that day will be a great surprise to many. "For in the days before the flood, people were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day Noah entered the ark, and they knew nothing about what would happen until the flood took them all away. That is how it will be at the coming of the Son of Man" (Matthew 24:38-39). We wait for the day Jesus comes back, and waiting for that day seems slow. On the day it happens many people will think it came out of nowhere. They will perceive it as extremely sudden, as they face judgment unprepared. Where do you stand? I'm suggesting that if you perceive God's judgment as being slow, that might be a good thing. God does all things at the right time, of course, but I would much rather the arrival of His justice seem painfully slow to you than for it to be a complete and sudden surprise. That is how it will be at the coming of the Son of Man, at this Day of Judgment. Slow . . . then sudden. Come, Lord Jesus!

CURRY CONNECTION

What Shall We Do?

In Acts chapter 2, Peter preached before a large crowd, and about three thousand souls were added to the church. After answering an important question, "...'Men and brethren, what shall we do?" (Acts 2:37 KJV), let us review what they did.

"But Peter, standing up with the eleven, lifted up his voice, and said unto them, Ye men of Judaea, and all ye that dwell at Jerusalem, be this known unto you, and hearken to my words..." (Acts 2:14). Peter gave the people an opportunity the hear the Gospel, a needed element of salvation, "So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God" (Rom. 10:17).

"Now when they heard this, they were pricked in their heart, and said unto Peter and to the rest of the apostles, Men and brethren, what shall we do?" (Acts 2:37). When the Word states that they were pricked in their heart, they wanted the answer for salvation. Does this not imply they believed what they heard? The element of belief was there. "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life" (John 3:16).

"Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost" (Acts 2:38). Repentance and baptism are the two elements named here in this Scripture. Two separate actions are taken by a believing individual wishing for the gift of eternal life.

The verbal confession of Jesus Christ as the Son of God is not directly named in this conversion account but is in other Acts conversions. Our confession is an essential element of salvation (Rom 10:9-10). However, this account does give an example of the continued act of confession, living faithfully.

"And they continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, and in breaking of bread, and in prayers" (Acts 2:42). The element of continued faithful living is given. One must be faithful to obtain salvation. "Blessed is the man that endureth temptation: for when he is tried, he shall receive the crown of life, which the Lord hath promised to them that love him" (James 1:12). As we continue through our study of the book of Acts and add the elements of salvation as we go, one should conclude that an individual seeking eternal life must hear the Gospel, believe in Jesus Christ's death, burial, and resurrection, repent of sins, confess his faith in Jesus Christ, and be immersed in baptism for the remission of sins, then continue to live faithfully. After one continues in this truth till death, they will be given a crown of life (Rev. 2:10).

MINUTE OF MEDITATION Heard on FM 96.9 Greater than Solomon

King Solomon was great. He had something like 50,000 pounds of gold coming in every year. His wisdom was so vast he could explain or solve whatever he faced. In the middle of a place that was pretty much always at war he found a way to have peace. He was so great that his reputation spread, and the queen of Sheba traveled far to see him for herself. When she got there "she was overwhelmed."
