## **Doug's Discussion**

## The Same Seen Differently

How people act toward us is influenced by our actions. This can be really obvious in cases with an ex-girlfriend or boyfriend. Let's say you have two girls who have both come to know the same guy, and if you ask both of them about what kind of person he is you might get a very interesting variety of responses. One girl tells you he is the worst. One tells you he is the best. But which is it? He cannot be both the worst and the best, can he? Perhaps he matured quite a bit between the two relationships. Another possibility is that he was pretty much the same guy, but certain choices made in the first relationship led to negative responses and those choices don't exist in the second one. (For example, trust issues leading to checking his phone, leading to frustration from the lack of trust.) Same guy, different responses to different choices.

In our culture today we don't really like to think that our actions might have anything to do with our situation. It seems many people would rather play the victim. If a relationship isn't working out it HAS to be the other person! That's an unfortunate view of life because I believe that can affect even our nearness to God. How we experience God is also affected by our actions. Why does it seem like God is ignoring all my prayers? That's not how that believer over there is experiencing God, so why me? It must be God's fault. OR . . . maybe it's because of your decisions. Here's a couple of choices from the Bible that can affect prayers: "If a man shuts his ears to the cry of the poor, he too will cry out and not be answered" (Proverbs 21:13). Yeah, remember when you didn't give a tip on your last five trips to Applebee's? So does God. "Husbands . . . be considerate as you live with your wives, and treat them with respect . . . so that nothing will hinder your prayers" (1 Peter 3:7). You how you keep yelling at your wife to shut up? "Back at ya." -God

God is unchanging, immovable, immortal. And yet, despite this consistency, two people will come to this same Lord and come away with two entirely different experiences. "To the faithful you show yourself faithful, to the blameless you show yourself blameless, to the pure you show yourself pure, but to the crooked you show yourself shrewd" (Psalm 18:25-26). The "crooked" person might not be a big fan of his experience with God, but the pure and the blameless walk away in awe of God's magnificence. What accounts for the difference? I submit that it is our actions, our moral choices, that affect how we experience the Lord. Don't be conformed to the pattern of this world's victim mentality. Instead, be conformed to the likeness of Christ. Such a decision, your decision, changes everything.

## MINUTE OF MEDITATION Heard on FM 96.9 Ordinary Might Not Be

Have you ever joked around with a noisy kid and said something like "what's the deal with all the racket? Are you trying to raise the dead?" Well... the truly enthusiastic toddlers among us might make us wonder, but the dead don't seem to mind, and they certainly don't get up to protest.

I think some might say that the dead hear nothing, and nothing will raise them. However, when Jesus walked the earth, He challenged that wisdom. John 5:25 records Him saying: "I tell you the truth, a time is coming and has now come when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God and those who hear will live." That was not an empty boast, and Jesus didn't even need to shout. He would speak normally, words like "little girl I say to you, get up." The girl was dead at the time, but that's exactly what she did. The dead girl heard the voice of Jesus. Think on that! She heard, and she got up.

And Jesus says, "do not be amazed at this, for a time is coming when all who are in their graves will hear his voice and come out . . ." So no, your noisy kids cannot raise the dead, despite their excessive volume. But Jesus can. Marvel at the power of the voice of Jesus. ## <u>Am I Able?</u>

I believe it was Henry Ford who said, "Whether you think you can, or you think you can't--you're right." Our mind has a firm hold on what we are capable of. As I stood there after the twins were born, looking at two little boys tucked in tightly deep in sleep. I remember secretly asking myself, "Can I do this?" can I provide, protect, and fulfill my God-given responsibility as a father? It all appeared so scary for me at the time that someone else was utterly dependent on me. Could I succeed? As I have worked to accomplish challenging tasks in life, I have learned that there is wisdom behind the message of The Little Engine That Could. The little engine focused his mind by repeating the motto, "I think I can, I think I can, I think I can...." Thanks to this positive reinforcement, that Little Engine could pull that other train over the mountain to safety. So, as it turned out, he could.

Now, what could this story mean to a Christian? Are Christians guilty of thinking we can't keep going when times get hard? Do we ever tell ourselves, "I can't, I can't, I can't...." instead of, "I know I can." "With God, all things are possible" (Matt 19:26), which means we can have confidence during difficult times. If we are operating according to God's will, we can't fail. "What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us?" (Rom 8:31 NKJV). We can remember several biblical accounts where people thought they could not, but God still accomplished His will through them because they did not quit. Moses doubted he could free the Israelites, but it was God's will, and God supplied the help. Ester, thanks to the providence of God despite her being a little orphan girl, was able to rescue the Jewish nation. Elijah, battling deep depression and anxiety, was able to accomplish great things, all thanks to God supplying his needs. You are not alone when you think, "Am I able?".

When it comes to accomplishing the will of God, we should know it is thanks to Jesus Christ that we can have the strength to keep going. "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me" (Phil 4:13). Why did God believe in Moses, Esther, Elijah, etc.? The Parable of the Talents illustrates that God is the One who provided the talents. "And to one he gave five talents, to another two, and to another one, to each according to his own ability; and immediately he went on a journey" (Matt 25:15). So, He knows what you are capable of. God believes in you. Since God believes in you, work to stay motivated to do His will. All of our good accomplishments are really His accomplishments through us. Strive to keep the positive mindset Paul mentions.

Finally, brethren, whatever things are true, whatever things are noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy—meditate on these things (Phil 4:8).

Just as The Little Engine That Could, think positively, knowing God knows you can, I know you can, and you know you can. May God continue to bless your journey even if you feel you are current-

ly in an uphill battle.
