

Doug's Discussion

Motivated by Love

There's more than one reason to do a good deed. Sure, you may think all good deeds are created equal, but I don't think that's true. I think the quality of the deed depends greatly on your motivation. For example, you know someone who needs a little money, so you give them the money. Someone else does the same thing. Are the deeds necessarily equal? Well...no. One of you gave the money out of love for the person that was in need. The other gave because someone else was in hearing distance when the request was made, and who wants to appear stingy? Or maybe the giving happened because this gift would grant the power to ask a favor in return later. Motivations matter.

There are people who do a lot of works and think they will be greatly commended by the Lord someday. However, we know from scripture that many will be surprised. "Lord, Lord, did we not . . . do many mighty works in your name?' And then will I declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from me, you workers of lawlessness'" (Matthew 7:22-23). How can these people do all these works, even, in this case, miraculous works, and not be pleasing to God? In the context of this passage, we would have to conclude that despite their mighty works, they were living by their own will instead of God's will. In other words, their motivations were bad. Maybe they wanted the power for ungodly purposes, like Simon in Acts 8. Maybe, all they cared about was their own glory. For whatever reason, all their good deeds didn't amount to much.

May this not be true of any of us! Have you ever done a good deed and then stood around expecting a thank you or even demanded it? Have you expressed your indignation at the lack of appreciation (probably leading to some mumbled words of thanks)? I fear when people do things like this, Jesus shakes his head sadly and says: "I tell you the truth, they have received their reward in full" (Matthew 6:16). Don't you see? Your motivation wasn't love! And if that's not your driving force for all your good works, you could give away all you have, and it wouldn't matter. "If I give all I possess to the poor and surrender my body to the flames, but have not love, I gain nothing" (1 Corinthians 13:3). Yes, go and do good to all people. Not out of any selfish reason but because you "love your neighbor as yourself" (Mark 12:31).

It is How God Made You

Let's take a minute. To talk about carving pumpkins. Every year, my kids and I will pick out some innocent pumpkin with the idea of carving a masterpiece. We have carved many faces over the years, and not one of them is exactly alike. You know what has never happened to me before is for the pumpkin to be unhappy with its new face. We always carve it with a smile. How silly would it be for the pumpkin to be upset with me? Its carver! "But indeed, O man, who are you to reply against God? Will the thing formed say to him who formed it, "Why have you made me like this?" (Rom 9:20 NKJV). You know

God has done a great job with His creation, and that includes you. Be glad because you are one of God's special creations. "I will praise You, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made; Marvelous are Your works, And that my soul

CURRY CONNECTION

It's Not a Job It's a Ministry

In a steel mill in Huntington, WV the screeching and crashing sound of the Electric Arc Furnaces can be heard blasting in the background. The environment is so loud that it raddles the clothing on your body, but the earplugs somewhat shut you out of the world, so your thoughts out sound the furnace. When I would often lift myself up to put on my wet silver coat, which protected us from the 3,000-degree liquid we were about to capture, I would think to myself as my hard hat soaked up the drops of sweat from my brow. "Why am I doing this? What is the purpose?" The older men there, covered in black dust, would smile brightly and say, "You do it for the paycheck, boy!" Thoughts of my wife and kids always fueled me to work the long, hot hours. This was a job, and I worked the job because it provided for my family. As soon as I was able to find a better job, I took it. We work jobs to get something in return.

As Christians, do we view our service to Jesus as a job where we expect our bi-weekly paycheck, or will we move on to something we think is better? The truth is that our service as Christians is not a job but a ministry. The apostle Paul instructed Timothy to fulfill his ministry, not his job. "But you be watchful in all things, endure afflictions, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry" (2 Tim 4:5 NKJV). Indeed, we understand that being a Christian is rewarding, and some in their ministry even earn a paycheck for their labor. But is that why we do it? If we work for Jesus for a self-ish purpose alone, then it is a job to us, and we lose out on it being a ministry. A ministry is a service, which is what the word ministry is standing in for in the above Scripture. The purpose of us being Christians is clothed in the coat of service. Service to His church, service to others, and most importantly, service to Him.

I recently thought after hearing of one person's life struggle, which eventually ended in the grace of the Lord. "How great it is to do the work of an evangelist!" As a servant of Jesus, you can provide a great service of faith, hope, and love, sowing peace into the hearts of the world around you. Your ministry can affect generations exceedingly and abundantly above what we think. Really, what better thing is there? Jesus has sent His humble servants into all the world to preach His gospel not just for our benefit but for the purpose of serving God and each other.

How then shall they call on Him in whom they have not believed? And how shall they believe in Him of whom they have not heard? And how shall they hear without a preacher? And how shall they preach unless they are sent? As it is written: "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the gospel of peace. Who bring glad tidings of good things!" (Rom 10:14-15).


